

Subject: Allow PLGL 405 (Criminal Law Practice) to satisfy requirements for B.S.
in Criminal Justice Degree

The Department of Criminal Justice and Paralegal Studies proposes adding PLGL 405 (Criminal Law Practice) as an acceptable course for the Criminal Law CRJS 260 requirement in the curriculum for the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice. This matter was discussed and formally voted on (approved) by the faculty at the 9/13/05 Departmental faculty meeting.

The current degree BS in Criminal Justice degree requirements specify that all students must take CRJS 260 (Criminal Law).

As a matter of practice, the CJ Program has routinely approved PLGL 405 (Criminal Law Practice) to substitute for CRJS 260 (Criminal Law) when this course provides a better preparation for the student's overall professional aspirations or capacity issues only allow for offering one or the other course. It has become apparent that PLGL 405 is an appropriate curricular equivalent to the current requirement. Students choosing this option are those considering employment in some aspect of law enforcement, application to law school, and some pursuing careers in corrections and probation and parole.

This course is scheduled on a regular rotation of once per academic year and approval of this proposal will not require any additional university resources.

Passing/approval of this proposal would formalize the course options that a student may take in this area and allow for appropriate change in the degree audit, online, as well.
