



Subject: Drop Required Course Intro to SW (SOCW 102) from B.S. in Criminal Justice Degree Requirements

The Department of Criminal Justice and Paralegal Studies proposes dropping the specific course requirement of SOCW 102 from overall curricular requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice. This matter was discussed and formally voted on by the faculty at the 9/13/05 Departmental faculty meeting.

Three credits of elective choice are proposed in its stead.

The Social Work Program, as a matter of capacity, can only offer this course to declared SW majors. These capacity issues were discussed between faculty in the SW and CJ programs. It was agreed that CJ faculty would no longer advise students to take this course, even though it appears as a degree requirement.

As a matter of practice, since spring 2005, CJ students have not been able to enroll in this course and have taken 3 credits of elective to replace the course. This arrangement, although agreed upon by all involved faculty and programs, requires submission of course substitution forms for all CJ majors at this point. Additionally, students find the degree audit confusing.

Passing/approval of this proposal would formalize an existing practice and allow for appropriate change in the degree audit, online, as well.
