SUBJECT: Statement of Intent for a minor in Military Studies and Leadership at Lock Haven University

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to receive approval from the College of Education and Human Services Curriculum Committee and University Curriculum Committee on the Statement of Intent to begin a minor in Military Studies and Leadership at Lock Haven University. The interdisciplinary minor will be designed for all students with special interests in military, leadership, and national security affairs. The minor would consist of 18 credits from the following courses at the university and an external experience or internship which focuses on leadership.

Military Science – 9 credit hours of the following:

* A student will be required to have an internship or external experience which provides an experience in military, leadership or National Security Affairs. An example of an External Experience/Internship focusing on Leadership or Military affairs is attendance and graduation of the 33 day Leadership and

Development Assessment Course at Fort Lewis, WA or the 28 day Leader's Training Course at Fort Knox, KY. Another example of a Leadership Internship is a Sports Administration major working at a YMCA where they have specific responsibilities for a program. Credit hours are given where applicable by degree plan and academic advisor. If the internship or external experience is approved for 3 credit hours, it meets the requirement for a course under Leadership.

2. The idea of conferring a minor in Military Studies and Leadership is not new to PASSE. Slippery Rock University offers a minor in Leadership for completion of Military Science curriculum and additional coursework. Also, The Pennsylvania State University offers a minor in Military Studies. See enclosures for examples from other universities.

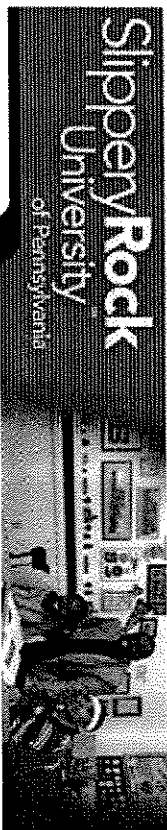
3. Recommendation: Lock Haven University approves the Statement of Intent to begin a minor in Military Studies and Leadership at Lock Haven University.

This interdisciplinary minor is designed for all students with special interests in military and national security affairs. Military emphasis is provided in one of three areas--Aerospace Studies, Military Science, or Naval Science. American military forces have played an important role in our domestic and international history and will continue to have significant involvement in policy arenas relating to national security and international relations. Students elect one military service branch for their prescribed courses and select two additional courses from appropriate history and political science courses emphasizing national security policy. At least 6 credits must be taken at the 400 level.
