RE: Nursing Curriculum Change - GPA Requirement

Per suggestion of Therese Sayers, Department Chair, and following discussion of faculty regarding review of data collected on graduates and current students, I am submitting the following information for consideration of the committee.

For retention/promotion in the nursing program, the faculty have discussed and approved at a special Faculty Organization meeting that the GPA requirement be increased from the present 2.0 to a 2.5. This change, if approved, would become effective for students entering the program Fall 1994. However, it will not affect those students currently enrolled in Nursing. The current overall GPA of 2.5 required of a student wishing to transfer to the nursing curriculum will not change.

The Nursing Department, per approval of Faculty Organization, presents the following policy for change, effective Fall 1994.

RETENTION/PROMOTION POLICY

The policy for retention/promotion in the Associate of Science in Nursing Program is:

1. Attainment of a scholastic average of 2.5 each semester on a 4.0 scale.
2. Achievement of a "C" level or above in the theory portion and credit on the clinical section of the nursing courses.
3. Achievement of a "C" level or above in each of the following courses: Anatomy and Physiology, Physiology, Microbiology.
