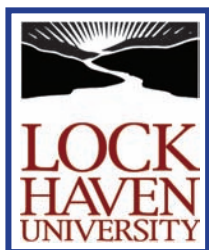

B.A. History

You will gain a global perspective on history, seeing how different cultures interact and how societies change. You will experience doing what professional historians do: using evidence from the past to reconstruct what happened and why. If you choose the Public History track you will learn how history is preserved and presented in archives, museums, and historical parks. Our students have gained real-life experience by interning at several local museums and county historical societies and at the State Historic Preservation Office.

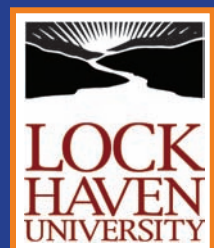
You can also major in Secondary Education with a concentration in Social Studies (B.S.Ed. degree), which prepares you to teach social studies at the junior and senior high school levels (grades 7 through 12). This program is recognized for its quality by the National Council for the Social Studies.

Faculty

All the history faculty hold doctoral degrees and are experts on Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, and the United States. They have published numerous books and articles on topics such as labor history, history of gender and race, military history, environmental history, economic history, and colonialism.

Career Opportunities

Recent students have gone to graduate school at Pepperdine, SUNY Buffalo, Temple, Central Washington, and West Virginia and to law school at University of Vermont. They work at the National Archives in Washington and teach in school districts throughout Pennsylvania and in Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, New York, and Arizona.

B.A. Political Science

You will study political ideas like democracy and globalization and apply them to the U.S. and other political systems, to relations between nations, and to policy issues both within and across national borders. If you choose the Pre-Law concentration, it includes courses that develop skills and aptitudes for law school.

You are encouraged to do an internship to gain experience in real-life situations. Recent students have interned in the Governor's Budget Office, the Governor's Office for Health Care Reform, the Department of Community and Economic Development, the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, the U.S. Department of Defense, several local political campaigns, a U.S. Attorney's office, and numerous law firms.

Faculty

Political science professors have experience on local government boards and in political campaigns. They present and publish their research and hold leadership roles in state and regional scholarly organizations. Their expertise and personal experiences cover the U.S., Europe, Asia, Africa, and Latin America.

Career Opportunities

Recent graduates work in the U.S. Departments of Defense and Veterans Affairs, in the Office of the Governor, as lobbyists and legislative staffers, and in political consulting. Others have studied in M.A. programs at Syracuse University, University of Pittsburgh, Lehigh University, and Long Island University. Several have studied law at schools including University of Akron, Georgia, Dickinson, Harvard, Michigan State, New York Law School, Ohio State, Thomas Cooley, and Widener.

B.A. Philosophy

Socrates claimed that the unexamined life is not worth living which has inspired the western tradition's greatest philosophers as well as the most influential of today's thinkers. As a philosophy major, this tradition will provide you the basis for your own examinations of questions like: "What is beauty?", "What is the moral life?", "What is the best way to organize our society?", "Does God exist?", or "What is the ultimate nature of reality?" to name a few. The pursuit of philosophical wisdom will help you develop critical thinking and communication skills that will be invaluable in whatever career you might choose.

The Ethics Center

The Ethics Center encourages dialogue among students, faculty and the community regarding a range of contemporary ethical issues. Recently, the focus has been on ethics in professions such as business, education, and health care. The Ethics Center shows films, hosts speakers, and co-sponsors an undergraduate essay competition each year.

Faculty

All philosophy professors hold doctoral degrees and have a broad range of teaching and research interests. Several have received awards for excellence in teaching and mentoring. Your small classes will be taught by these professors, not graduate assistants.

Career Opportunities

Many philosophy majors go on to graduate school with the goal of teaching in a college or university. A growing number of others are pursuing careers in a variety of fields where their communications and critical thinking skills are in high demand such as business, education, government, health care, journalism, law, religious ministry and social work.

B.A. International Studies

You will study the processes of globalization and the interactions among diverse nations and cultures. You can choose from concentrations in human geography, global economics, international relations, Latin American studies, or culture and language. You can emphasize Africa, Asia, Europe, or Latin America in your studies or you can choose a global approach.

Most of our students study abroad for a semester or more. LHU's Institute for International Studies maintains exchange partnerships with more than 30 universities in over 20 countries.

Faculty

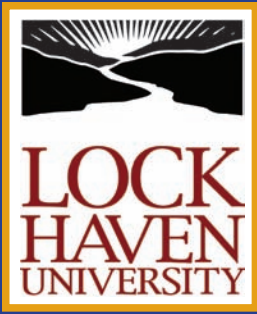
Professors contribute to this program from a large number of disciplines, including political science, geography, history, economics, foreign languages, anthropology, sociology, art, music, and English. They have taught courses, conducted research, and traveled extensively in dozens of countries. They have earned a number of Fulbright and other awards for international teaching and research.

Career Opportunities

Graduates have continued their studies at Villanova University, American University, Georgetown University, Dickinson School of Law, University of Texas, and University of Chicago. They have worked in Japan, China, and Africa. They have been employed by the Peace Corps (both in Washington D.C. and in the field), by the United Nations in Japan, by the JET Program in Japan, by the U.S. International Trade Commission in Washington, as a photo interpretation analyst in Washington, and in corporate positions in the U.S. and China.

Facilities

The Stevenson Library is interfaced with the PASSHE state library network allowing access to millions of volumes and research materials. Classrooms are also equipped with SmartBoards allowing PowerPoint presentations and interfacing with the Internet.
