### **Management/APSCUF Coaches**

Meet and Discuss Session 12

Tuesday, February 21, 2006

**APSCUF representatives present were:** Mark Cloud, Kelley Green, Kristen Geissler-Selvage, Aaron Russell, Pat Rudy and Joannette Saba-Sturm as recording secretary.

**Management representatives present were:** Kwesi Aggrey, Denise Shoemaker, Tara Fulton, Jill Reitz, and Alan Anderson.

Sharon Taylor was invited by APSCUF and attended.

#### **I. Approval of Minutes**

The minutes of December 16, 2005 were approved. The minutes of January 27, 2006 were postponed.

#### **II. Grievance Update**

M. Cloud reported that the Grievance Report remains unchanged.

#### **III. Signage for McCollum Field Update**

K. Aggrey reported that the funding concerns have been resolved and management is awaiting delivery.

#### **IV. Installation of Batting Cage(s) Update**

K. Aggrey confirmed with S. Taylor that installations have been completed, and K. Green applauded management for their quick response to this concern.

#### **V. Vehicle for Coaches of Women's Sports Update**

M. Cloud reported concern about the men's football team having an automobile and wanted to confirm private ownership. A. Anderson reported that he spoke with A. Jones, who reported such ownership was presented to the Athletic Director and Assistant Director of Athletics who were also offered an opportunity to negotiate ownership or loan for a vehicle. A. Anderson inquired about a car reportedly given to Coach R. Bonomo. S. Taylor reported that Miller Brothers offered Coach Bonomo a car in summer 2004, which is shared with the entire athletics department. S. Taylor further reported that this vehicle was actually donated to the foundation so that the entire athletics department can utilize it. A. Anderson reported his understanding is that the head football coach went out and negotiated with an automobile dealer as a private issue and that A. Jones spoke to S. Taylor and P. Campbell about negotiating with car dealerships for additional usage. S. Taylor reported that she understood A. Jones would help negotiate the car on the football coach's

behalf. S. Taylor reported she, A. Jones and P. Campbell did meet with one dealer regarding a car loan/negotiation, but she felt the dealership expected to meet President Miller and was disappointed when Dr. Miller was not present. K. Aggrey reported that it is the University's standing that no commitment was made to the coach with respect to the car, and they would like to see evidence if such is present. S. Taylor reported this could be mediated simply by management offering coaches of female sports a vehicle from their fleet.

#### **VI. Coaches' Office Space**

M. Cloud reported that this concern has been approached by faculty recently, and D. Proctor indicated that single offices should be 100 square feet, 80-100 square feet is sufficient for temporary usage, under 80 feet is unacceptable, and 175 is sufficient for sharing for two people. M. Cloud reported that at least six coaches share offices that are about 106 square feet and would like to schedule time with management to review these and have management look further into replacement space. K. Aggrey requested these offices be added to the list APSCUF is to provide management. Before offices are reviewed, coaches will be notified of such time(s). K. Aggrey reported that he brought this concern to cabinet yesterday, and intends to bring President K. Miller, D. Proctor, B. Little, and the Deans around for review. S. Taylor inquired if there are intentions to relocate faculty offices down to east campus. K. Aggrey indicated this may be considered and ultimately some offices will need to be moved.
