APSCUF DELEGATES APPROVE STRIKE AUTHORIZATION VOTE

Delegates attending the APSCUF Legislative Assembly in Monroeville Friday unanimously approved the taking of a strike authorization vote of the full APSCUF membership.

APSCUF members at the 14 State System universities will participate in a two-day voting process in the near future. The exact dates of the voting have not been established by the organization.

If the membership approves the measure, the State APSCUF Executive Council will have the authority to call a strike if and when the council believes the action is necessary.

APSCUF REPRESENTS THE 6,000 FACULTY MEMBERS AND COACHES AT THE 14 STATE SYSTEM UNIVERSITIES. OVER 101,000 STUDENTS ARE ENROLLED AT THE STATE SYSTEM UNIVERSITIES.

President's Report

As promised, here is the rest of the president's report from the Sieg Membership meeting.

Proctoring exams for students with special needs update

Rey Junco and Dr. Stewart are still working on this. Plans for library cubicles and TVs didn't work out.

Large section update

In the end, **twelve** sections are being offered with enrollments of approximately 120, all in the Hall of Flags. The large sections in the physical sciences are a separate entity from this, as you may recall. Dr. Stewart has heard the Executive Council's opinion that this "experiment" should not expand, and should probably be phased out.

Secretarial Support

At August Meet and Discuss, Drs. Little and Stewart provided APSCUF with a list of academic support staff and the names of the people for whom they served. Ralph Harnishfeger is analyzing this data, and we will proceed from there.

Distance Education Definition

Due to some vagaries in application of the Distance Ed. article of the CBA, Dr. Stewart asked Paddy O'Hara-Mays to generate a definition of what constitutes a distance ed. course. She did so and it was passed at Meet and Discuss to Mark Cloud, chair of the university d. ed. committee for review.

Teaching Effectiveness

Please look over the document created by Drs. Johnson and Phillips and approved at Meet and Discuss. Copies are available from your department chair, or Cheryl in the APSCUF office.

Dr. Stewart has asked for a review of the process for evaluations on campus, and Drs. Johnson, Phillips, Cloud and Harnishfeger and Denise Shoemaker (the AA in charge of this data in the Provost's Office) were selected for an ad hoc committee to study the process and quickly provide one for fall evaluations.

Software to Stop Pop-up Advertisements during Internet Use

Academic Computing has responded to this request with a software link. See earlier email from Jim Heiney, or ask academic computing.

Committee on Electronic Handling of Student Evaluations and Testing

Dr. Stewart, in a desire to handle both the problem of student testing in the first reader and to eliminate much of the paper in the evaluation process, set up a committee to look into this. Mark Cloud and Susan Strayer serve on this committee; early discussions indicated that this is probably not possible at this time.

Student Welcome Activities Success

Many faculty and a handful of emeriti participated in the Student Welcome activities on Sunday, August 24th. Punnipa Hossain did a survey that showed high parental and student satisfaction with this event; we gave out all the APSCUF buttons and hundreds of copies of Dr. Fulmer's letter to students AND Mark Cloud's graphic presentation of some data in Dr. Fulmer's letter. Please be prepared to join in this activity next year: if we do it annually, it not only creates goodwill with students and parents, but also allows us a forum during negotiations turmoil.

The above is the answer to the question (as in Alex Trebek's Jeopardy): What did the LHU faculty members say to the Class of 2007 as they arrived on campus?

As in previous years, we distributed a questionnaire to a group of freshmen to gauge the effectiveness of our annual Student Welcome Table efforts on August 24 (Sunday) 2004. The questionnaire was given out to a total of 85 students in two freshman courses. Of the 85 students, 62 returned the questionnaires. Of those who re-

TIAA-CREF Reclassifies Retirement Plan

TIAA-CREF has reclassified its retirement plan as a 401(a) plan. This required the automatic re-enrollment of 10,000 employees into new contracts. Investment allocations were planned to be automatically carried over. This did not happen for some faculty. Faculty members who have selected TIAA-CREF as their retirement provider should check their portfolio to insure correct investment allocation. **Minutes for the APSCUF
136th Session
Legislative Assembly
September 19-20, 2003
Monroeville, PA**

In attendance from LHUP were Steve Hicks (President), Rick Lilla (Delegate), Bob Myers (Delegate), Fay Cook (Delegate), Jeff Burnham (Delegate), Carol Rehn (Alternate Delegate), and Howie Congdon (State Grievance Chair).

The central topic of the assembly was the stalled negotiations process. President William Fulmer, and members of the Negotiations Team made the case that the System has been unwilling to negotiate in good faith. Head negotiator Don Mayer noted how unusual it was that there was no closure on a single article under consideration. The team pointed out that it needed a strike authorization vote to try to get the other side to move. In response, a motion to call an authorization-to-strike vote on the local campuses on September 29th and 30th was passed unanimously. President Fulmer stressed the importance of a high-turnout and the need to vote "Yes" in order to give the team the leverage they need. The local leadership should emphasize that this is not a vote to go on strike, but that it gives the APSCUF leadership the right to call a strike if necessary.

Terry Madonna discussed the political situation in Harrisburg, noting that the negotiations do not seem to be "on the scope" of Governor Rendell, who is preoccupied with other issues. There was much discussion of why the argument that we should accept an "AFSCME-like settlement" is flawed. AFSCME required \$60

million to rescue its health and welfare system (which, unlike APSCUF's, pays for their health insurance). Furthermore, the argument that AFSCME's settlement involves a co-pay for insurance is specious, since that co-pay would only be implemented if their health and welfare fund dips below its reserves, which is unlikely in this contract period.

There was a great deal of discussion of the System's comment that large classes were "cash cows." This comment apparently triggered a student protest at Slippery Rock during a recent visit by the Chancellor. Faculty and students--some dressed as cows--protested the attitude of the System toward both students and faculty. The leadership emphasized that these protests could be very effective in moving the System toward good-faith negotiations.

The Health and Welfare Fund Committee reported that the fund is very healthy, with a \$540,000 surplus. The State Meet and Discuss Committee reported on concerns with the system's attitude toward distance-education, especially the Keystone University Network, which is offering non-credit classes which have not been first offered to faculty, as the contract requires.

At the end of the Friday morning session, President Fulmer read a press release from the System that had been issued in the morning. The gist of the release was that the faculty union was not taking into account the reality of the economic situation faced by the system. There was much discussion of the distortions of the truth in this release, and after lunch APSCUF issued its own

press release, noting the sincere efforts we have made to negotiate in good faith, and the hypocrisy of asking us to "accept economic realities," when the System has been steadily growing both the numbers and the salaries of its managers.

The Public Relations committee discussed the efforts made to present our side of the issue. Posters and pamphlets addressed to both faculty and students have been distributed to the local campuses. Television and radio spots will run at the most opportune time.

Giving the Retirement Committee report, Deb Wynn reported that the committee is continuing to look for ways to improve TIAA-CREFF benefits.

In the Special Services report, Nancy Koutris asked the assembly to approve an APSCUF telephone plan with AT&T and Verizon, which would save APSCUF members money on monthly charges. The assembly unanimously approved this.

A report was given on the Student / Faculty Liaison Committee, which discussed some of the faculty activities in welcoming new students to the various campuses at the beginning of the semester.
