There is a Chinese proverb that states "I hear and I forget. I see and I remember. I do and I understand." This proverb certainly applies to Lock Haven's faculty! This month's Kudos column submissions were quite impressive. Here are some of the activities in which our colleagues are participating.

**Lawrence (Tom) Farley** (Department of History, Political Science, and Economics) presented a paper to the Select Committee on the Consequences of Changing Political Status of the Parliament of Queensland, Australia. The submission dealt with a proposed revision of the Queensland electoral law that would require an immediate special election in the district of a member of parliament who changes his/her political party affiliation during the term of a parliament. He has also published a review of the book *Presidential Decisions for War: Korea, Vietnam and the Persian Gulf* by Gary R. Hess in the *Australian Journal of Political Science*.

**Steve Williams** (Mathematics Department) presented at the Pennsylvania Council of Teachers of Mathematics State-wide meeting in Erie on Friday, October 29<sup>th</sup>. His topic was titled *Breathing Life into the Standards: From Formal Language to Workable Form*.

**Glenn Hosterman** (Performing Arts Department) will be serving as guest conductor for three upcoming music festivals. On November 23rd, December 2nd, and December 3rd, he will guest conduct the Lycoming County Senior High County Band at Williamsport High School. On January 7th, Glenn will guest conduct the PMEA District 4 All-Star Directors' Jazz Band and, February 3-5, 2005, Glenn will guest conduct one of the two PMEA District 4 Jazz Ensembles in a festival at Juniata Valley High School in Alexandria, PA.

**Philip Huber** (Art Department) has recently returned from Benedict College, Columbia, SC, where he presented an exhibition of the works of John Sloan. The exhibition will hopefully initiate cultural and artistic collaborations between Benedict College and LHU. While there, Professor Huber gave presentations on John Sloan's life and works and taught a class in illustration. Philip has also had a work from his recent series *Interiors in Motion* accepted in the 30th Bradley International Print and Drawing Exhibition in Illinois.

**Steve Guthrie** (Outdoor Recreation Management) recently attended the annual International Conference on Outdoor Recreation and Education (ICORE) in Nashville. This conference was sponsored by the National Association of Outdoor Recreation and Education (AORE). He presented a session called *An Alternative View of Judgment and Decision-making Theory* and facilitated a roundtable discussion on *Curricular Components of a Four-year Outdoor Recreation Degree*. In addition, following a year as Past-President, he will be serving next year as Treasurer of the AORE.

Since we coaches have some ability to negotiate our individual salaries, the State Coaches Committee voted to provide a listing of all coaches' salaries to local coach representatives and to the office managers to keep on file in their local APSCUF offices. This information is to be provided upon request by individual coaches.

Coach salary information is not confidential. It is available to the public under the Pennsylvania Right to Know Law, and The State Coaches Committee wants to make it easier for our coaches to access this information. The list will include information on coaches at all of the PASSHE Uni-

versities as of Spring 2004. You will note that not all Universities list the coaches' sports and that data for about 100 part-time coaches is missing. We are hopeful that some of these bugs will be worked out when the Fall 2004 salaries are provided and there is a smoother transition within the Systems SAP program.

Nevertheless, we hope that this information, as it exists, will be helpful since you, as representatives, probably can identify the sports of the coaches at your campuses, and other coaches will know the names of coaches in their specific sports at the other Universities.
