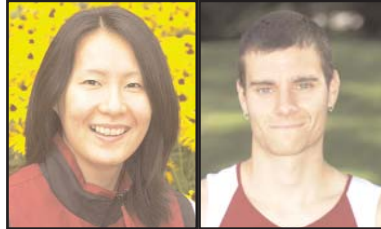

leading the nation in hitting percentage for the second straight season. Li was also ranked fourth in the nation in blocks per game.

Senior runner Chris Cowan, originally from Horseheads, N.Y., collected his second-straight All-America honor after leading the Bald Eagles to a ninth-place team finish at the national championship meet. Cowan placed 30th overall to pace all Haven harriers.



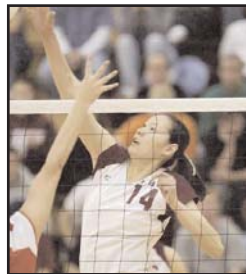
Joe Wiegner (Cross Country)

Senior harrier Joe Wiegner, who hails from Ivyland, Pa., captured All-America honors following a 36th place finish at the NCAA

championship. The senior helped lead the Bald Eagles to a ninth-place finish at the national championships, their best finish ever.

Rebecca Steffen (Field Hockey)

Senior defender Rebecca Steffen claimed Division I All-America honors from WomensFieldHockey.com after a standout season for the Lady Eagles. Steffen collected multiple honors, including NEC Defensive Player of the Year and Division I First Team All-Mideast Region honors.



▶▶▶ LADY EAGLE VOLLEYBALL MAKES FIFTH NCAA ELITE EIGHT APPEARANCE

The Lock Haven University volleyball team wound down the 2004 campaign in the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight round, failing to halt the eventual champion Barry University in three games, 30-14, 30-21, 30-28.

The Lady Eagles constructed yet another remarkable season at 28-4 with Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference and NCAA Atlantic Regional championships.

At the close of the year, Haven blockers led the nation with a number-one ranking with 3.83 team blocks per game. Sophomore Li YiZhi, a First Team All-American and PSAC Player of the Year, anchored the Lady Eagle attack by claiming her second-straight national hitting percentage title. Li registered kills on .464-percent of her swings from the middle hitter slot.

▶▶▶ **HAVEN HARRIERS RETURN FROM NATIONALS WITH PROGRAM'S BEST FINISH**

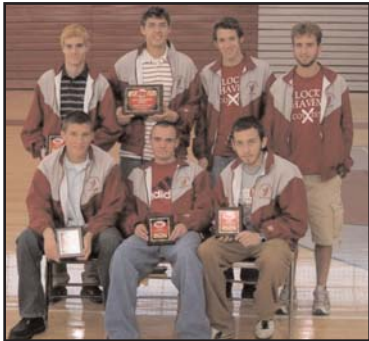


The 2004 men's cross country season produced the crowning achievements of a top-ten national finish, a Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) title and an

NCAA East Region trophy.

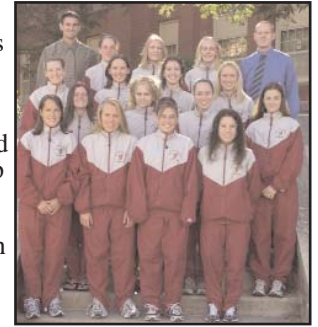
Head coach **Aaron Russell (LHU '96)** won both the USCCA East Region and PSAC Men's Coach of the Year titles, and **Greg Davis (Catawissa, Pa.)** was awarded PSAC Rookie of the Year.

This Bald Eagle unit finished ninth at the national meet, the best in the history of the Lock Haven cross country program, bettering its previous mark of 13th in 1999. LHU brought home two All-America trophies compliments of **Chris Cowan (Horseheads, N.Y.)** and **Joe Wiegner (Ivyland, Pa.)**, giving it a total of seven. The 2004 campaign was one of the best seasons in LHU history yet, earning five team titles and setting school-records with six all-conference and five all-region runners.



▶▶▶ **LHU WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY BUILDS FOR FUTURE**

The Lock Haven University women's cross country team leaned on the continually developing experience and leadership of three juniors and three sophomores to wrap up the season with an 11th place at the PSAC championships and a 13th place finish at the NCAA East Regional.



Junior **Sarah Robertson (Mechanicsburg, Pa.)**, freshman **April Salinas (Mill Hall, Pa.)** and sophomore **Kat Davey (Springfield, Pa.)** paced the young squad, finishing one-two-three for the Haven at both conference and regional meets.

Fall Dixon Trophy Update

Powered by Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) titles from men's soccer, men's cross country and volleyball, Lock Haven University was ranked fourth after the fall season in the Dixon Trophy standings.

Indiana University (Pa.) leads the rankings with 65 points, followed by Shippensburg University, which has 52.5 points. Kutztown University is in third place with 52 points, followed by LHU (50) and Bloomsburg University (49.5) rounding out the top five.

The presentation of the Dixon Trophy will take place after the spring sports season. The final determination of the trophy winner is based only on an institution's best 12 finishes - the top six men's and top six women's placements.

This year will mark the 10th presentation of the Dixon Trophy, named after F. Eugene Dixon Jr., former chairman of the Board of Governors of the State System of Higher Education, of which all 14 universities of the PSAC are members. LHU won the trophy in 2001 and 2002.

▶▶▶ **BALD EAGLE SOCCER REGAINS CHAMPIONSHIP FORM**

Back to the conference playoffs for the first time since 2000 and the national tournament for the first time in over a decade, the Haven men's soccer team made the most of the situation by churning out its 18th PSAC title and advancing to the NCAA Division II Northeast Region finals. The Bald Eagles, who were ranked as high as 15th in the national poll, strung together a 13-game non-loss streak towards the latter half of the season, helping yield a 15-5-3 overall record.

The Haven went 5-2-1 in PSAC regular season duals to secure home field advantage for a 2-0 win over Millersville University in the first round of conference playoffs. LHU then hosted the title match against West Chester University, besting the Rams 2-0 for the championship trophy.

Making its first appearance back in the NCAA playoffs since 1992, Lock Haven drew California (Pa.) University in the opening round of the Northeast Region championship. The match-up was settled in double overtime, as LHU's **Patrick Long (Lock Haven, Pa.)** converted on a free kick with just 29 seconds remaining for the 2-1 victory. The Haven would falter against eventual Final Four participant Dowling College in the regional championship, however, falling 4-0 to the host team.

The Bald Eagles closed out the year ranked 16th in the nation and swept the conference awards for Coach of the Year (**Doug Moore**), Player of the Year **Dustin Bixler (Mechanicsburg, Pa.)** and Rookie of the Year **Ashley Rosindale (Bradford, England)**.

FIELD HOCKEY DOMINATES NEC IN FIRST SEASON AT DIVISION I



Not the type of team to back away when it's required to sit out of the conference and NCAA playoffs due to its move from Division II to Division I, this season's Lady Eagle field hockey team made it clear that it was not to be overlooked. Lock Haven laid claim to the Northeast Conference regular season title, charging through the mandated season with an unblemished 8-0 conference record. In total, the Lady Eagles assembled an 18-1 overall ledger including a 12-game run to close out the season.

Three Lady Eagles dotted the Division I All-Mideast Region squad while Haven athletes also cleaned up on NEC post-season awards. The Haven's **Rebecca Steffen** (Hawley, Pa.) was named the Defensive Player of the Year while Head Coach **Pat Rudy** ('77) was the Coach of the Year. Another five players earned All-NEC honors. Wrapping up the collection of accolades was senior **Katie Stewart** (Boyetown, Pa.), who earned Valley National Bank Northeast Conference (NEC) Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete honors.

LHU Fourth in NCAA Division II Fall Director's Cup Standings

Powered by strong NCAA finishes from men's soccer, men's cross country and volleyball, Lock Haven University is ranked in a tie for fourth place after the fall season in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) standings for NCAA Division II.

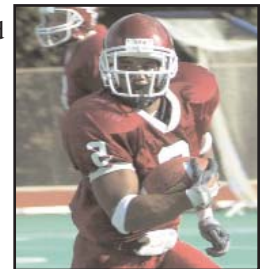


Grand Valley State University leads the rankings with 297 points, followed by Edinboro University, which has 212 points. Adams State University is in third place with 190 points, followed by LHU and Carson Newman College (189) tied at fourth.

Lock Haven has three top-30 finishes in the NACDA standings since 1996, including its highest-ever finish of 25th in 2002.

FOOTBALL WRAPS UP 2004

The 2004 Bald Eagle gridders scored their third-straight home-opener victory and came away with wins in both overtime games on their way to a 3-8 season. The Haven posted the 35-19 advantage over Cheyney University in the season opening tilt in Hubert Jack Stadium, the third-straight home lidlifter victory and the first campaign-opening win since 1992. LHU's other wins came in extra periods, securing a 33-30 overtime victory against Mansfield University on the road, before an exciting 16-13 extra period finish over Clarion University on Haven turf. During the season, senior running back **Maurice Walker** (N. Braddock, Pa.) set new LHU record for career rushing attempts (691) and wound up third in total ground yardage (2,783). Wrapping up end-of-season accolades, three Bald Eagles, defensive lineman **Jarrold Hendricks** (Rockton, Pa.), running back **Maurice Walker** and wideout **Rafael Smith** (Pittsburgh, Pa.), were honored as All-PSAC West players.

Healthy CHOICES for Life

The Healthy CHOICES for Life alcohol education program, funded by a grant from the NCAA, will involve LHU student-athletes in educating other students in the university and surrounding communities on making low-risk decisions regarding the consumption of alcohol.

Program developers will train and recruit student-athletes and other students to be organizers, implementers and evaluators of the program.

Student-athletes will be encouraged to assume leadership roles, and act as mentor and peer educators. They will be responsible for educating their fellow students on the legal, social and health risks associated with alcohol abuse. They will also encourage students at the university and at local schools in the community to make well informed, low-risk decisions on alcohol-related matters.

Kendra Picked To Lead Lady Eagle Soccer

Heather Kendra, a seven-year veteran of the head coaching ranks, was named head women's soccer coach at Lock Haven University in December. Kendra comes to the Haven from Carnegie Mellon University. Kendra spent all seven of her head coaching seasons with the Tartans of Carnegie Mellon, posting a 67-44-12 record and a 2003 Eastern College Athletic Conference Mid-Atlantic Tournament championship.



HAVEN WOMEN'S SOCCER TURNS IN STRONG SEASON

Guided by a strong crew of upperclassmen as well as a spirited group of newcomers, the 2004 Lady Eagle soccer team finished second in the PSAC Western Division before advancing to the PSAC Tournament quarterfinals. LHU went 11-7-2 overall and 8-1-1 in the PSAC West, its ninth consecutive 10-or-more wins season.

Lock Haven put six players on the All-PSAC team and had another two, sophomore forward **Holly Homsher** and senior defender **Danielle Smith** (Johnson, N.Y.), earn mention on the NCAA Division II All-Northeast Region squad. Smith also earned academic recognition, becoming the first Lady Eagle to receive NSCAA Academic All-America honors, after picking up Third Team accolades.
