## Spotlight on Director of Athletics Sharon E. Taylor



Sharon E. Taylor (LHSC '66) is currently in her 18th year as Director of Athletics at Lock Haven University, but has been a member of the Haven community for over 40 years dating back to her days as a field hockey, women's basketball, and softball student-athlete as well as a Health and Physical Education major.

Following graduation, Taylor took on responsibilities of Physical Education instructor and the field hockey and tennis coach at Susquehanna University.

From there, she returned to her alma mater, serving as a professor in the Health and Physical Education Department while beginning a coaching stint that would lead to national titles with both field hockey and lacrosse programs. Taylor would remain at the helm of the field hockey program from 1973 through 1995, becoming the winningest coach in LHU history with a record of 333-96-27 and collecting six national championship trophies over the 23-year span.

*"You don't have to be around athletics very much in order to see its benefits," said Taylor.*

Taylor's administrative experience began in 1973 as the Director of Equal Opportunity in Sports, progressing to present day as Director of Athletics, a position she has held since 1987.

Keeping track of the spectrum of national organizations Ms. Taylor has been an integral and highly influential part of is a task left for the overly ambitious. Presently, she is the President of the United States Field Hockey Association (USFHA), a position she will hold through the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China. She has served terms as president of the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators, the Eastern College Athletic Conference and the College Field Hockey Coaches Association. In addition, she has served on numerous committees in the NCAA and U.S. Olympic Committee.

"Other than my own coaching career, one of the accomplishments since 1987 that I am most proud of is moving the programs to at least one full-time coach -- persons dedicated completely to the attention of their sport and their student-athletes. When I started there were four or five head coaches full time. Now no one has a dual assignment."

Additional accomplishments that Taylor views as particularly memorable include: winning back-to-back Dixon trophies; putting the transportation policy (all teams travel in buses) into action; and improving the scholarship support for our student-athletes.

"You don't have to be around athletics very much in order to see its benefits," said Taylor. "From any perspective, whether it be a mother or father who sees a child develop, a faculty member who sees how it helps the student grow, or when we recognize that students graduate from college learning at least as much or more that they'll use in life from athletics as they have from academics. Life lessons learned from sport, good or bad, will serve them throughout their lives."

"For myself, over my entire career, seeing those opportunities develop for women has been especially gratifying -- it's nice to see both sons and daughters have the same opportunities."

## LHU TRACKSTERS CAPTURE PSAC RUNNER-UP HONORS; SENDS DMR TO NATIONALS

The Bald Eagle indoor track and field team claimed four individual championships before finishing as the runner-up squad at the 2005 PSAC Indoor Track and Field Championships. Pressing on in the post-season, the distance medley relay earned itself a trip to nationals at the Reggie Lewis Center in Boston, Mass., to compete in the DMR's inaugural season as an NCAA championship event.

Over the season numerous records were set, and a total of 14 student-athletes collected All-PSAC honors from the indoor championship. Haven competitors at the top of their field included **Keith Veldhuis** (pentathlon), **Fieldon Daubert** (weight throw), **Aaron Benson** (5000m) and **Jim Dempsey** (high jump).

The nationals-bound relay had high hopes, but an unfortunate collision with another team during the handoff between the first and second legs knocked the Bald Eagles just out of contention for All-America honors into ninth place.

### ▶▶▶ HAVEN SWIMMERS MAKING WAVES

It may be small in number but the waves the Lock Haven women's swim team has been creating are anything but. Fourth-year head coach Bart Garlick's squad went 4-2 in dual meets on the season and capped off the year with a ninth-place finish at the highly-competitive PSAC championship meet including five top-10 finishes in relay events. The team composed of a junior, six sophomores, and two freshmen managed to climb up the Division II rankings to finish 13th in the Collegesswimming.com national poll.

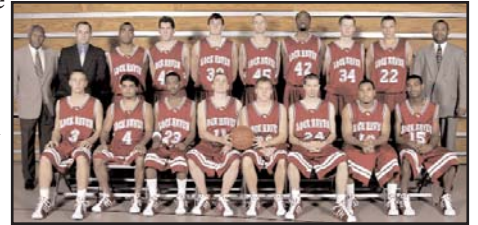
The Lady Eagle swim team was eighth among all Division II programs and headlined the list of PSAC programs on the All-Academic team list with a combined team GPA of 3.27.

### ▶▶▶ BALD EAGLE BASKETBALL CLOSES OUT 2005 WITH RECORD AND ONE ALL-PSAC NOD

The Lock Haven men's basketball team closed out the season at 4-23 overall, including the biggest victory of the season, a 69-63 win over #21-ranked Edinboro in front of a raucous Thomas Fieldhouse crowd. During the course of the season, senior shooting guard **Eddie Christiano** broke the Haven's record for consecutive games played, appearing in 107 straight contests since his freshman year. Another senior, local favorite **Joe Walker**, brought home All-PSAC West honors after leading the Bald Eagles with 13.6 points and 8.0 boards per contest.

**▶▶▶ Compliance Corner**

According to the NCAA, the conduct of LHU's intercollegiate athletic program shall include being held accountable for the acts of all individuals that have been identified as "boosters". You are considered a Lock Haven booster if you:

- Make or have ever made a donation to the Lock Haven University Foundation, the Department of Athletics, or to any of the men's or women's athletics programs;
- Are, or have ever been, a member of any athletics department booster group;
- Are, or have ever been, involved in promoting Lock Haven's athletic programs in any way;
- Are, or have ever been, a member of the University's coaching staff.

Extra benefits to student-athletes or their family members from boosters are specifically prohibited. For example, PROHIBITED EXTRA BENEFITS (not allowed by NCAA rules) mean that a booster MAY NOT:

1. Give student-athlete cash or loans in any amount
2. Give student-athletes gifts or free services (e.g. laundry, haircuts, dry cleaning) of any kind
3. Provide special discounts for goods or services ...

**Once A Booster... Always A Booster**

Once an individual is identified as a "booster" or "representative of athletics interests", that identity is retained forever, even if the person no longer supports the athletics program.

**Rules to Remember**

1. Only coaches can be involved in the recruiting process. Alums may be called by a prospect to discuss the University generally, but they may not talk about the athletics department and should refer those questions to athletics staff members.
2. An impermissible contact, even if unintentional, could subject LHU to penalties imposed by the NCAA. Prospects could lose eligibility for competition at LHU because of a recruiting violation by a booster.
3. If student-athletes accept any benefit based on their athletic ability, those athletes will lose all eligibility for intercollegiate athletic participation.
4. It is University policy that an athletics administrator will be on the Board of Directors of each sport booster club as a resource on rules compliance.



## Klacik Era Begins at LHU

Bringing with him 17 years of Division I and I-AA coaching experience, **John Klacik** was named LHU head football coach in early March. He served most recently as offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Youngstown State University. Klacik, a 1988 LHU alum, has spent all but one season of his coaching career at YSU, and was a part of three NCAA I-AA National Championship teams.



## LADY EAGLE HOOPS RANK IN TEAM BLOCKS

For first-year head coach Val Curtis' 2005 Lady Eagle Basketball team, rejection was actually a good thing. A very young Haven squad battled through injury and small numbers to reject 87 opponent shots, the second best blocking total in LHU history (the top coming in 1996-97 with 97 blocks). That total also placed the Haven fifth among all PSAC teams in the category in 2005.



Over the course of a rocky 4-23 season, it was sophomore **Allison Hall** who paced LHU in scoring with 11.5 points a game. Another sophomore, **Ginger Williams**, pulled down 6.3 boards a contest to lead LHU in that category. In addition to the team blocking accomplishment, junior **Kristy Shadduck's** 27 blocks notched her a spot in single-season history, tied at the top with Becky Peter's 27 swatted shots in the 1996-97 campaign.

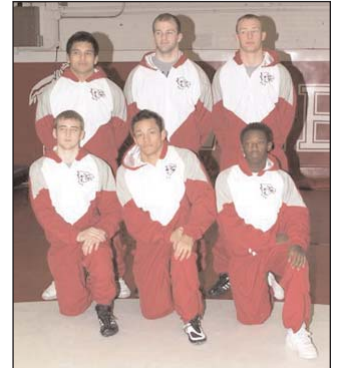

▶▶▶ **HAVEN GRAPPLERS SECOND AT EWL'S; TAKE SIX TO ST. LOUIS**

Third-year head coach Rocky Bonomo's young 2005 Bald Eagles (6-8, 3-3 EWL) took to the mats with the same enthusiasm as in years past, capping off the campaign with a runner-up finish at the Eastern Wrestling League Championships and a six-strong contingent representing the Haven at the national championship in St. Louis, Mo. The dual meet season opened with a dominating 41-3 victory over Millersville University and wound down with a 21-19 win over #22-ranked West Virginia University and a 37-7 romp over Clarion University. The Haven battled back from a fourth-place finish at the PSAC championships to pocket the squad's highest place finish at the EWL tournament since 2001 by taking runner-up honors. LHU claimed two EWL champions in Joshua Medina at 149 lbs. and Morgan Horner at 197 lbs., and had three others record third-place finishes. A wild-card bid on top of the five automatic qualifiers gave the Bald Eagles six tickets to the national tournament where they would finish in a tie for 52nd place. Wrapping up post-season honors, head coach Rocky Bonomo was awarded EWL Coach of the Year honors by his peers.

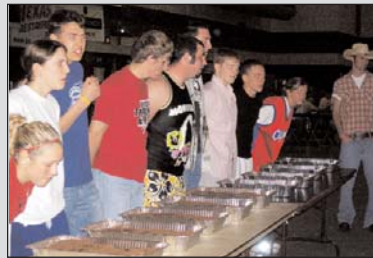
**CHOICES and SAAC Host POWER HOURS Event**

## ▶▶▶ Alum Makes \$55,000 Gift to Haven Gridders

**Milton "Stan" Allen**, a 1986 All-PSAC First Team player, pledged \$55,000 -- \$11,000 a year over 5 years -- to solely be used for scholarships. The scholarship money will go to top level athletes, skilled in football, who exhibit exemplary social skills and maintain a 2.5 grade point average or above.

Allen is an area manager for Ferguson Enterprises, a national wholesale company that distributes a variety of construction goods, and is in charge of around \$700 million in annual sales out of California, Oregon and Washington.

"If everybody's waiting for it to turn around instead of helping it turn around, then we'll never get there," Allen said about the University football program. "It's human nature for folks to be jumping on the bandwagon. I don't want to be on the bandwagon. I want to be the guy pulling the wagon."

Allen once stood on the gridiron alongside new head football coach John Klacik and made his mark on LHU football as a standout receiver with 1,976 career yards.
