24 Hour Study Area

One of the attractions of the library's remodeling project is the addition of a 24 hour study area. Tara Lynn Fulton, Director of Library Services, has facilitated the creation of a pleasant atmosphere for the campus community to study during times when the library is closed.

The room serves several functions. The comfort of upholstered furniture clusters and beanbag chairs invite casual study. Set off from the main area by open partitions are two areas furnished with tables and chairs to accommodate group study and discussion. Two ports and a small workcounter accommodate network access for Powerbooks and laptops.

The 24 hour study area has a separate entrance and a unisex restroom. All users will be asked to leave the 24 hour study lounge 15 minutes prior to the closing of the library so that all materials not belonging in the room may be taken back to the main section of the library. Access to other floors through the emergency staircase and to the main library will be locked before allowing students to re-enter the study area.

During Fall semester 2001, the 24 hour room is only scheduled to close during Thanksgiving vacation.

From the Circulation Desk: E-mail notification

E-mail notification is an efficient and cost-effective way to contact library users about materials placed on hold, recalls and overdue books.

Every semester student mailing information (i.e. home, campus and e-mail address) is downloaded from the University's system. At the end of each day our system produces a report that automatically sends notices to library users about their holds, items that are on recall status or about any materials that are overdue. Library users can then pick up requested books, return materials in a timely fashion to avoid fines or renew their materials online through PILOT, our online catalogue.

Of special note, since many students use other e-mail sites instead of their LHU e-mail address, it is important that students stop by the circulation desk to notify the library of their alternative e-mail address.

Remember - Have your University ID with you when you want to check out a book. For your protection, our policy is to see a photo ID and to scan the barcode on the back of your ID for all transactions.
