

Finding Theater Resources on the Web

Google.com (<http://www.google.com>)

One of the first places to begin any web search. Type in the key subject words of your topic and Google's search engine not only locates a site, but leads you to the site which is most often visited (not necessarily the best site, but this could indicate a degree of usefulness of the site). Note: the image search tab.

American Theatre Web (<http://www.americantheaterweb.com>)

If you are searching for information about a particular U.S. theater, show, or regional theater organization, this is the place to start. Search by the name of the theater or by region/state.

The World-Wide Web Virtual Library: Theatre and Drama (<http://vl-theatre.com/>)

A collection of theater links, whose scope aims for the multi-cultural and multi-lingual. Its most remarkable features are its index to plays available on the internet (in several languages)

Theatre History on the Web (<http://www.videoccasions-nw.com/history/jw20th.html>)

This is a quite comprehensive, academically-oriented, site which provides a nice insight into issues of theater history. In addition to an index of topics (divided mainly by region, but also by period), there is a "Today in Theatre History" section, as well as a featured topic and a small script archive.

Theatrepedia (<http://www.perspicacity.com/elactheatre/library/library.htm>)

This is a site with short definitions or descriptions of plays, playwrights, theatre people, theatre terms and theatre characters. There is lots of information here.
