LHU inducts new members into Criminal Justice National Honor Society

The Lock Haven University Chapter of Alpha Phi Sigma National Criminal Justice Honor Society welcomed new members at its 2011 reception and induction ceremony on Tuesday, October 25.

Among the requirements for membership in Alpha Phi Sigma is a 3.2 grade point average, both in the discipline and overall.

The inductees and their guests were welcomed by Dr. Tamson Six, professor and chair of the Department of Criminal Justice and faculty adviser to Iota Sigma Chapter of Alpha Phi Sigma. Chapter president Desjenee Davis presented membership certificates and pins to the new inductees.

As of spring 2011, 52 students and 1 faculty member have been inducted into the Lock Haven University chapter of Alpha Phi Sigma.

The LHU chapter is very active. As they continue to grow, some of their on-campus activities include, but are not limited to, the East Campus planting project, meet-n-greet and midterm

social, a window display at Stevenson Library, meeting with exploratory studies students, sponsoring class speakers, and conducting a student writing lab (which they developed and implemented to aid in the development of peer writing skills). Members have also conducted the Criminal Justice Pre-advising Program for freshmen and some sophomores. They answer questions regarding minors, how to access online degree audit, and how to register for classes; they also explain the degree requirements for the Criminal Justice major, what an internship entails, and what Criminal Justice organizations exist on campus.

Some of the club's off-campus activities include the Adopt-A-Family Program, a local park paint and clean-up project, an Easter egg hunt at Hoberman Park, and a local food drive.

Alpha Phi Sigma is the only Criminal Justice Honor Society for Criminal Justice Majors. The society recognizes academic excellence of undergraduate, graduate students of criminal justice, as well as juris doctorate. Founded in 1942, the society has over three hundred and sixty Chapters. Alpha Phi Sigma is a member of the Association of College Honor Societies.
