Global Honors Program to host 'Last Lecture' speaker

The Global Honors Program at Lock Haven University will host the second installment of its Last Lecture Speaker Series on Tuesday, November 29, 2011. The event will be held from 6:00-7:30 PM in the Greenberg Auditorium of the Health Professions building and is free and open to the public.

The Last Lecture Speaker Series was started in the spring of 2011 and is based on the premise of the book "The Last Lecture" by Randy Pausch, which served as the summer reading for the Global Honors Program from 2008-2009. Each semester, a current or former LHU professor is invited to give his or her "Last Lecture" with only one prompt: "If you only had one more chance to address a group of students, what would you say to them?" In April of 2011, Dr. Mary Rose-Colley, currently interim dean of the College of Education and Human Services, served as the honored lecturer.



This semester's honored lecturer is retired LHU Professor of Communications Dr. Douglas Campbell. Currently an adjunct professor of Writing and Literature at the Galen College of Nursing in Florida, Dr. Campbell taught Journalism and Mass Communication for 31 years until this past spring. He will present his "Last Lecture" on the topic of "Escapism."
