LHU presents a Spanish film: An Odd-Couple Friendship in “Me Too”

Daniel, a 34-year-old college graduate with Down’s Syndrome has fallen in love with Laura, a female co-worker ten years younger than he is. This unlikely relationship is the focus of the Spanish movie “Yo, también” (“Me Too”), which will be presented at Lock Haven University on Wednesday, September 21 at 6:30 p.m. The screening will be in the Greenberg Auditorium, LHU Health Professions Building. The public is invited to this free event.

“Yo, también” is the first film to be presented by the 2011-12 Latin American and Spanish Film Series at LHU. The 2009 film, not rated, has English subtitles.

The film is set in Seville, Spain. Pablo Pineda, who plays Daniel, is the first European with Down to earn a major university degree. The film has been presented in the 2010 Sundance Film Festival, the 2010 Rotterdam International Film Festival, 2010 Seattle International Film Festival, and the 2009 San Sebastián International Film Festival.
