Lock Haven University fountain joins the “Think Pink” campaign
Part of Breast Cancer Awareness Month

It’s not an optical illusion. The Jury Fountain on the Lock Haven University campus has been dyed pink as part of an ongoing effort to raise awareness of breast cancer. October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month and the women of Zeta Tau Alpha sorority have focused on promoting breast cancer education and awareness.

Samantha Church, treasurer of the LHU chapter of Zeta Tau Alpha, said, “People are going to talk about the fountain being pink. If that makes a family member go and get a mammogram, then it has done its job.”

Lisa Szymendera echoed this statement. “To know the early detection stages is an important part in finding a cure.” She also pointed out that breast cancer affects men as well as women.



As part of their “think pink” efforts, Zetas have been “all over campus” during October with breast cancer awareness materials. Church urged everyone to “please support Zeta Tau Alpha and Lock Haven Football for our Pink Out game on November 5 at 3:00 p.m.”

Szymendera added, “When you “think pink,” think Zeta Tau Alpha.”
