Good food and good fun await in Margaritaland! Murder Mystery Dinner at LHU

Members of the public are invited to “Murder in Margaritaland,” a night of mystery, food and fun at Lock Haven University. The Women’s Lacrosse Team’s annual Murder Mystery Dinner will take place on Friday, September 30 at 7:00 p.m. in Rogers Gymnasium.

As the title suggests, the event will have a tropical Jimmy Buffet/Caribbean theme. The evening’s festivities include a dinner served by members of the LHU women’s lacrosse team. Of course, the centerpiece of the evening will be a murder. The game is afoot!

Participants may request major or minor roles in the event. Registrants will receive individualized invitations indicating their character, suggested attire, and certain details not known to the other characters. According to Kristen Selvage, head women’s lacrosse coach, “This is a great evening to come out dressed up in your character and play a role that you may have never played before. We have characters that are very involved and others that can simply sit back and watch as the mystery unfolds. All characters are welcome to join in and help solve the mystery.”

This is the fifth year the women’s lacrosse team is hosting a mystery dinner. According to Selvage, “We have had a great deal of support for this wonderful event each year. Community members, faculty, staff, parents, friends, family and students have enjoyed this night of murder and mystery.” Last year’s “Murder Among the Mateys” featured characters dressed as pirates and buccaneers. For “Murder at the Deadwood Saloon,” participants came dressed for a poker tournament in the wild west. This year’s event should be especially colorful as guests don bright tropical colors in keeping with the “Margaritaland” theme.

The cost for the event is \$50 a plate. Guests are encouraged to dress appropriately for an evening in the Caribbean, but costumes are not required. If guests would like to attend but do not want to participate, they can request a non-participant role.
