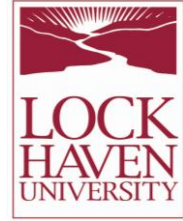


# LHU – by the Numbers

## Lock Haven University Is . . .

- A modestly priced, public, liberal arts university.
- Part of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education ([PASSHE](#)).
- A great place to live, learn and work!

## Location

- Lock Haven University is located on the West Branch of the Susquehanna River in the scenic mountains of central Pennsylvania, a few minutes off I-80 (exit 178).
- The historic town of [Lock Haven](#) boasts a vital downtown with tree-lined streets and beautiful Victorian homes in a safe and quiet environment.
- Lock Haven is less than an hour from State College and Williamsport and four hours from New York, Philadelphia, Washington, and Pittsburgh.
- Our [Clearfield](#) campus (an hour to the west) serves traditional and non-traditional students.

## Enrollment

- Undergraduate enrollment: 4,642 on the main campus (92% full-time), with 402 in Clearfield.
- 42% male, 58% female.
- 10% of undergraduates from outside Pennsylvania, including 28 states and 32 other countries.
- Diversity: 7% African-American, 2% Hispanic, 1% Asian, 2% International, 88% Caucasian.
- Graduate enrollment: 285.

## Academics

- 57 [majors](#) and certifications with 40 [minors](#).
- Most popular majors include: education, sport and recreation management, health sciences, criminal justice, business, psychology, social work, communication media, and biology.
- [Master's programs](#) in education, health sciences (Physician Assistant), and liberal arts.
- Degrees awarded (2007-08): 791 bachelor's, 88 associate's, 78 master's degrees.
- Average undergraduate class size of 28.
- [Honors Program](#) available for qualified students.
- Growing number of programs and courses via [distance education](#).
- All students complete an internship or other "real world" experience that connects learning to life.

## LHU Offers . . .

- Technology: student [laptop initiative](#), SMART boards, and wireless access in classrooms.
- Global perspective: more than 130 students [study abroad](#) each year (we offer programs in over 20 countries) and over 120 international students enrich the climate on campus.
- Active learning: internships and field experience, [service](#), and [undergraduate research](#).

## Faculty and Staff

- 576 full-time employees (fall 2008), including . . .
- 264 full-time faculty – 80% hold earned doctorates and 11% represent ethnic minorities.
- Courses are taught by faculty members, not graduate students or teaching assistants.
- Student-faculty ratio of 18:1.

### Admissions

- Average High School GPA: 3.2 (4.0 scale) with academic/college preparatory courses.
- Average SAT: 938 (Critical Reading and Math only). [College Board](#) Code (CEEB/SAT): 2654.
- Average ACT: 19 (composite).
- Percent of applicants admitted: 73%.

### Activities

- 18 NCAA Division I and II [athletic programs](#), including 2009 NCAA Division II softball champions.
- Over 130 [clubs](#) and student organizations.
- Club and [intramural](#) sports, movies, theatre, jazz and marching band, [student government](#), cheerleading, dance, student [newspaper](#), [ROTC](#), and much more.
- Lock Haven’s mascot is the bald eagle and our colors are crimson and white.

### Retention/Graduation

- Second-year persistence rate: 69%.
- Graduation rate: 30% within 4 years, 55%.

### Career Services

Within six months of graduation:

- 95% percent of 2007–08 graduates were employed, in the military, or pursuing further education.
- 86% of those employed were working in their chosen fields.

- 90% of full-time freshmen receive aid (2007-08).
