Bringing with him 17 years of Division I and I-AA coaching experience, **John Klacik** was named Lock Haven University head football coach, university administration announced March 8. Klacik served most recently as offensive coordinator/offensive line coach at Youngstown State University.

Klacik, an LHU alum, has spent all but one season of his coaching career at YSU, and was a part of four NCAA I-AA National Championship teams. He started with the Penguins as tight ends coach, working his way up the ladder through the offense, moving to wide receivers, quarterbacks, offensive line and then as offensive coordinator for the last four seasons. Klacik worked under current Ohio State University head coach Jim Tressel for 12 years.

He also spent the 2000 season at Division I Wake Forest University, working with the quarterbacks before returning to YSU in his most recent role.

A standout wide receiver, Klacik graduated with a bachelors degree in sports/fitness management from LHU in 1988. He led the Bald Eagles in receiving yards in each of his four seasons at the Haven, ranking eighth in school history with 1,976 career yards.

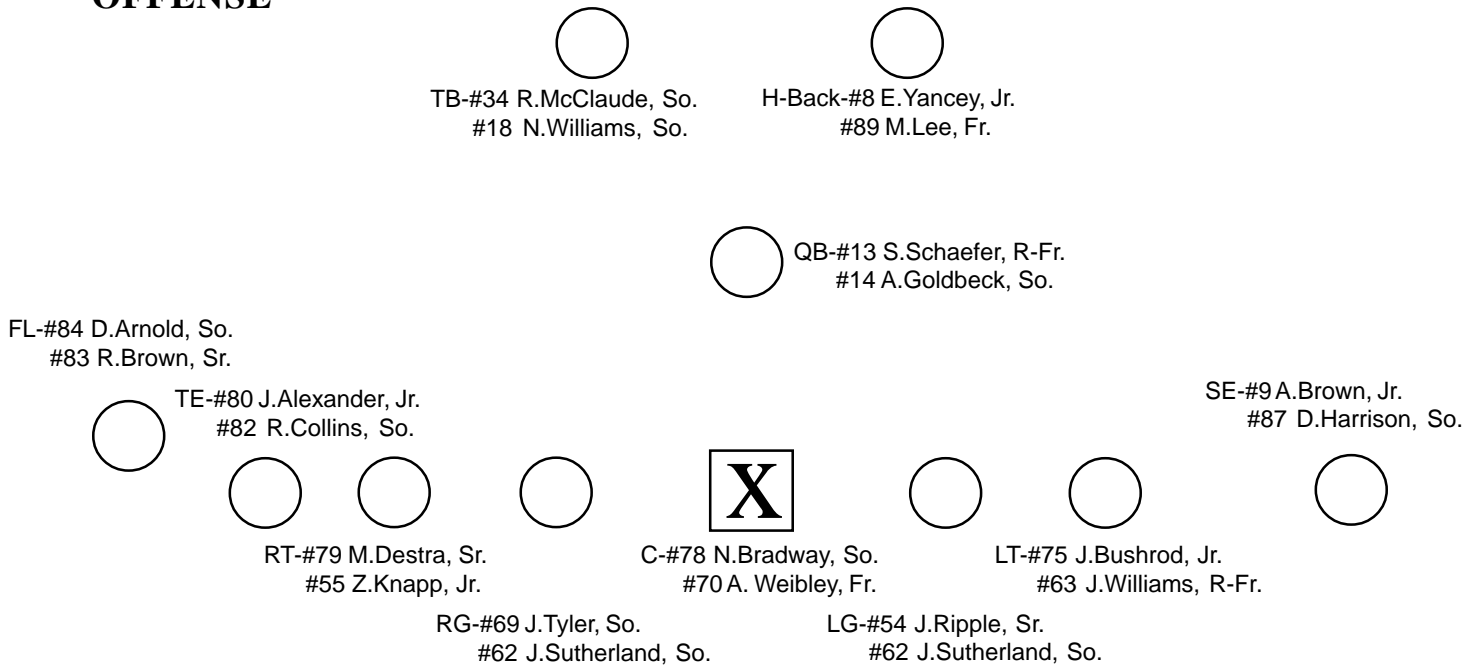

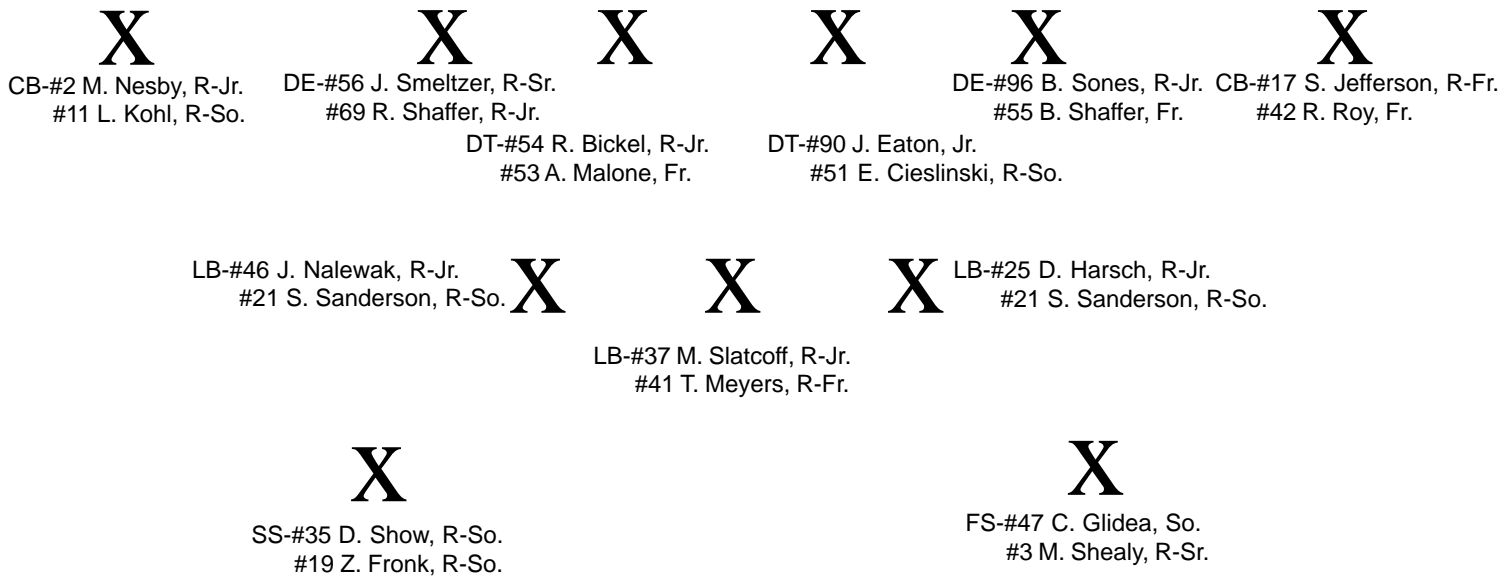

Scouting the Tigers

The Division I-AA Towson Tigers are led to battle by 14th-year head coach Gordy Combs.

The Tigers had a rough first year in the Atlantic-10 Conference, going 0-8 with a 3-8 mark overall in 2004.

Towson got 2005 started in exciting fashion, hitting a last-second field goal for a 29-26 win over Morgan State University. The Tigers pulled out the win despite turning the ball over seven times. Ten starters return to the offense, giving the Tigers one of the most experienced attacks in the A-10.

Pass defense is the Tigers' specialty, placing tops in the A-10 and seventh in all of Division I-AA. Consecutive opponents in 2004 (Rhode Island University and Bowie State University) were unable to gain a yard through the air against the Tigers. Senior co-captains return at cornerback, Allante Harrison and Davon Telp.

TU Head Coach Gordy Combs

Gordy Combs began his association with Tiger Football during Richard Nixon's presidency. It was the year "Love Story" was nominated for seven academy awards. The national debt at that time was \$382 billion. Farrah Fawcett was the year's most popular pinup queen. And lounge lizards across the United States were trying to convince the fashion world that at least one leisure suit should be hanging in every man's closet.

This fall marks Gordy's 36th year of association with the Tigers' football program. The tenure breaks down to three years as a player, 19 as an assistant and 14 as Towson's head coach.

This longevity has allowed him to be an active participant in the growth of Tiger Football from its Division III beginnings to the present membership in the very competitive Atlantic 10 Football Conference.

Last Time out for the Tigers

Towson University overcame seven turnovers and rallied from a 13-point deficit to beat crosstown rival Morgan State 29-26 on a field goal with one second left Thursday night in Johnny Unitas Stadium.

The Tigers' freshman quarterback Sean Schaefer shook off four interceptions to throw for 344 yards and two touchdowns, completing 26 of 44 attempts in his first college football game. He ran for another score.

Sophomore tailback Nick Williams added handsomely to Towson's 456 yards of total offense by rushing for 141 yards, picking up 9 yards on his first carry of the game that went for a touchdown.

Sophomore kicker Ron Halbruner had an extra point blocked and missed wide on another attempt but he too shook off those efforts to boot the game winner, a 29 yard field goal with one second left that gave Towson its 13th win over the Bears in the 18-game series.

"There aren't many times you can win a game when you turn the ball over seven times," said Towson head coach Gordy Combs. "It felt like for two and a half quarters we were beating ourselves but we've got good senior leadership and we kept at it."



Last time against Towson...

The Lock Haven football team suffered a 50-19 loss in their season opening contest on the road at Towson University. The Division I-AA Tigers overpowered the Bald Eagles, totaling 584 yards of total offense while the defense clamped down to hold LHU to three scoreless quarters and only 23 minutes of possession time. The Haven utilized a fourth-quarter, 19-point rally to prevent the shutout.

The Tigers totaled 10 points after one quarter of play, as Stephan Toth split the uprights from 23 yards out at 9:09 then Mikal Lundy topped off a 57-yard drive with a two-yard edge into the endzone.

Towson poured on the scoring in the second half, as quarterback Jason Amer connected with wideout Jason Galloway for a 44-yard touchdown reception midway into the period.

The Haven's **Rob Carey** gave the LHU offense its best field position of the evening to that point with a 62-yard kickoff return, slicing through Towson defenders through the middle of the field before being driven out of bounds on the far side of the field at the Towson 32 yardline. A fumble at the 20 yardline turned over the ball back to the home team, however, putting an abrupt end to any hopes of a touchdown in that drive.

Last Time out for the Bald Eagles

Faced with the daunting task of being the Division I-AA National Champions' opening opponent, the Lock Haven football squad (1-1) lost to James Madison University (1-0) Sept. 3, 56-0.

Falling victim to the big play, the Bald Eagles controlled the first and third quarters, surrounded by some breakdowns in both the second and fourth frames.

"I knew it would be a tough task to come in here, playing the defending champs at their home site," said LHU head coach **John Klacik**. "Our main goal was to be a better football team when we left this building tonight, and I'm proud of our guys that we accomplished that."

LHU caught the champs napping off the bat, recovering a surprise on-side kick for the first possession of the contest. The Bald Eagles were unable to do anything with that possession, but the Dukes would take the punt and march down the field on a nine-play, 82-yard touchdown drive to go up 7-0.

LHU would take over for the rest of the first quarter, getting plenty of yardage on the ground and a couple of completed passes as their best drive would stall at the JMU 37-yardline. Freshman **Jason Eby (Ulster, Pa./Athens)** looked poised in the first start of his career, completing four passes during the first quarter.

The Dukes would waste no time scoring in the second quarter, hitting a 36-yard scoring pass on the first play.

Three more scores later, the halftime mark stood at 35-0.

Junior signal-caller **Rob Kristiniak (Flourtown, Pa./Springfield Township)** got the starting nod for the second half. After seeing action on just one series in the first two quarters, Kristiniak led the Bald Eagles on their best potential scoring drive of the game, getting positive rushes from both **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** and **Chelstan C. Anderson II (Halifax, Pa./Halifax)**, and a pair of lengthy completions to junior wideout **Andrew Breiner (Hummelstown, Pa./Hershey)**.

The 13-play 57-yard drive stalled deep in JMU territory, allowing for a 35-yard field-goal attempt from **Dan Hagerman (Scottdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** that was partially blocked and sailed wide left.

Anderson finished with 10 carries for a team-best 26 yards, while Kristiniak finished 8-of-10 passing for 73 yards. Breiner grabbed two passes for 31 yards.

FYI

The Bald Eagles are averaging nearly a first down per catch, completing 27 passes for 218 yards, an 8.1 yard-per-grab average.

On the defensive side of the ball, reigning PSAC West Defensive Player of the Week **Jonathan Nalewak (Shamokin, Pa./Shamokin)** led the way with eight tackles. Joining his fellow linebacker, **Sean M. Sanderson (Enola, Pa./East Pennsboro)** made eight stops as well. Playing with extra incentive back in his home state of Virginia, freshman **Ali Malone (Springfield, Va./Hayfield)** had six tackles, sharing leading defensive line tackling honors with **Ryan Bickel (Morrisdale, Pa./West Branch)**.

Breakin' Records

~ Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman** booted one field goal in the 17-16 win over Cheyney, giving him 18 three-pointers in his career. Hagerman is tied with **Rich Mariott (1991)** for second place in the LHU record books, just six off the pace set by **Matt Mapes (2000)**.

~ Hagerman also made a pair of PATs, giving him 33 in his career, good for eighth on the list. Mapes and **Dan Young (1982)** stand next on the list at 35, while the all-time leader is **Charles Traber (1986)** at 71.

~ Junior wideout **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** has 11 career touchdown catches, putting him 10th after just two years as a Bald Eagle. Three receivers (**Jeremy Burkett (1998)**, **Jon Spinosa (1995)** and **Tommy Allen (1972)**) are all poised at 12 TD grabs, while **Marcus Burkley (2003)** leads the list with 19.

CHEYNEY, Pa. -- Junior tailback **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** has not attempted a pass in his three years at Lock Haven University, until today (Aug. 27). Marshall threw his first pass in the most crucial of situations—down six with less than two minutes left – hitting sophomore wideout **Adam Lawrence (Hanover, Pa./Shippensburg University)** in the end zone for the 17-16 win at Cheyney University.

First-year head coach **John Klacik's** first game was defensive-minded in the first half, coming to a close at a scoreless tie. Both teams had managed just 162 total yards by halftime, punting a total of 11 times in the first two quarters.

"The thing that stuck out to our staff was that the team didn't quit," said Klacik. "It was a back-and-forth game, especially in the fourth quarter, and there were times when things weren't going our way. But our kids never gave up."

The Bald Eagles had two scoring opportunities dashed in the second quarter, ended by a fumble and a missed field goal try. Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman (Scottdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** redeemed himself by breaking the 0-0 game just shy of 40 minutes in with a 43-yard blast for the 3-0 lead.

After the Bald Eagle defense held the Wolves to a punt, a second fumble gave Cheyney the ball at the Lock Haven 31. Three plays later, Cheyney's John Riley tied the score again with a 46-yard kick.

On Cheyney's next possession, a pair of Billy Mitchell runs of 12 and 28 yards set up the defense for a 45-yard touchdown pass hauled in by Dominique Curry, tiptoeing down the sideline, as the Bald Eagles found themselves down for the first time of the game. Sophomore **Eddie Cieslinski (Levittown, Pa./Pennsbury)** swatted the ensuing PAT, keeping the Wolves within a touchdown at 9-3.

Junior **Alvin Thomas Jr. (Johnstown, Pa./Greater Johnstown)** got things started with a 30-yard kickoff return, and junior tailback **Chelstan C. Anderson II (Halifax, Pa./Halifax)** scampered for a 36-yard touchdown two plays later, the first of his career.

An illegal use of hands penalty on the Bald Eagles' next possession forced them to re-punt, giving Cheyney's Tyree Cooper the chance for a 44-yard punt return touchdown putting his team back on top 16-10 with 1:58 left.

Made to punt on fourth-and-22 with 1:32 left and the LHU hopes dwindling, sophomore fullback **Adam Andrasko (Hawk Run, Pa./West Branch Area)** popped the ball loose from Cooper's hands, and freshman **Zach Fronk (Shenandoah Vly., Pa./East Stroudsburg University)** hopped on the loose ball, giving the Bald Eagles new life at the Cheyney 26 yard-line.

The conservative attack called for a pair of Anderson rushes, giving the Bald Eagles a first down. A Cheyney offside penalty surrounded by two more Anderson rushes gave the Bald Eagles third-and-three at the Cheyney nine.

Stacked in an I-Formation with two tight ends, the setup called for another run play. Klacik had another idea.

"When he called the play, I just remembered how we practiced it," said Marshall. "Everyone executed on the play and the line did a great job of selling the run. I just wanted to get the ball to Lawrence. I didn't care what it looked like, I just wanted it to get there." Cheyney's next possession was ended quickly with a game-sealing interception by junior **Jonathan Nalewak (Shamokin, Pa./Shamokin)**.

Mitchell chewed up 126 yards on the ground for Cheyney, but it was LHU's Anderson who had the only rushing touchdown, finishing with 67 yards on 19 carries.

Largest season-opening crowd in JMU
football history

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Faced with the daunting task of being the Division I-AA National Champions' opening opponent, the Lock Haven University football squad (1-1) lost to James Madison University (1-0) Sept. 3, 56-0.

Falling victim to the big play, the Bald Eagles controlled the first and third quarters, surrounded by some breakdowns in both the second and fourth frames.

"I knew it would be a tough task to come in here, playing the defending champs at their home site," said LHU head coach **John Klacik**. "Our main goal was to be a better football team when we left this building tonight, and I'm proud of our guys that we accomplished that."

LHU caught the champs napping off the bat, recovering a surprise on-side kick for the first possession of the contest. The Bald Eagles were unable to do anything with that possession, but the Dukes would take the punt and march down the field on a nine-play, 82-yard touchdown drive to go up 7-0.

LHU would take over for the rest of the first quarter, getting plenty of yardage on the ground and a couple of completed passes as their best drive would stall at the JMU 37-yardline. Freshman **Jason Eby (Ulster, Pa./Athens)** looked poised in the first start of his career, completing four passes during the first quarter.

The Dukes would waste no time scoring in the second quarter, hitting a 36-yard scoring pass on the first play. Three more scores later, the halftime mark stood at 35-0.

Junior signal-caller **Rob Kristiniak (Flourtown, Pa./Springfield Township)** got the starting nod for the second half.

After seeing action on just one series in the first two quarters, Kristiniak led the Bald Eagles on their best potential scoring drive of the game, getting positive rushes from both **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** and **Chelstan C. Anderson II (Halifax, Pa./Halifax)**, and a pair of lengthy completions to junior wideout **Andrew Breiner (Hummelstown, Pa./Hershey)**.

The 13-play 57-yard drive stalled deep in JMU territory, allowing for a 35-yard field-goal attempt from **Dan Hagerman (Scottsdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** that was partially blocked and sailed wide left.

The Dukes finished out the scoring with one TD in the third quarter and a pair more in the fourth for the 56-0 win. Anderson finished with 10 carries for a team-best 26 yards, while Kristiniak finished 8-of-10 passing for 73 yards. Breiner grabbed two passes for 31 yards.

On the defensive side of the ball, reigning Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) West Defensive Player of the Week **Jonathan Nalewak (Shamokin, Pa./Shamokin)** led the way with eight tackles. Joining his fellow linebacker, **Sean M. Sanderson (Enola, Pa./East Pennsboro)** made eight stops as well. Playing with extra incentive back in his home state of Virginia, freshman **Ali Malone (Springfield, Va./Hayfield)** had six tackles, sharing leading defensive line tackling honors with **Ryan Bickel (Morrisdale, Pa./West Branch)**.

"Obviously we wanted to play better than this," said junior offensive lineman **Adam Lanzendorfer (Roaring Spring, Pa./Central)**. "Hopefully we can learn from these mistakes and come out fighting next week."
