Bringing with him 17 years of Division I and I-AA coaching experience, **John Klacik** was named Lock Haven University head football coach, university administration announced March 8. Klacik served most recently as offensive coordinator/offensive line coach at Youngstown State University.

Klacik, an LHU alum, has spent all but one season of his coaching career at YSU, and was a part of four NCAA I-AA National Championship teams. He started with the Penguins as tight ends coach, working his way up the ladder through the offense, moving to wide receivers, quarterbacks, offensive line and then as offensive coordinator for the last four seasons. Klacik worked under current Ohio State University head coach Jim Tressel for 12 years.

He also spent the 2000 season at Division I Wake Forest University, working with the quarterbacks before returning to YSU in his most recent role.

A standout wide receiver, Klacik graduated with a bachelors degree in sports/fitness management from LHU in 1988. He led the Bald Eagles in receiving yards in each of his four seasons at the Haven, ranking eighth in school history with 1,976 career yards.

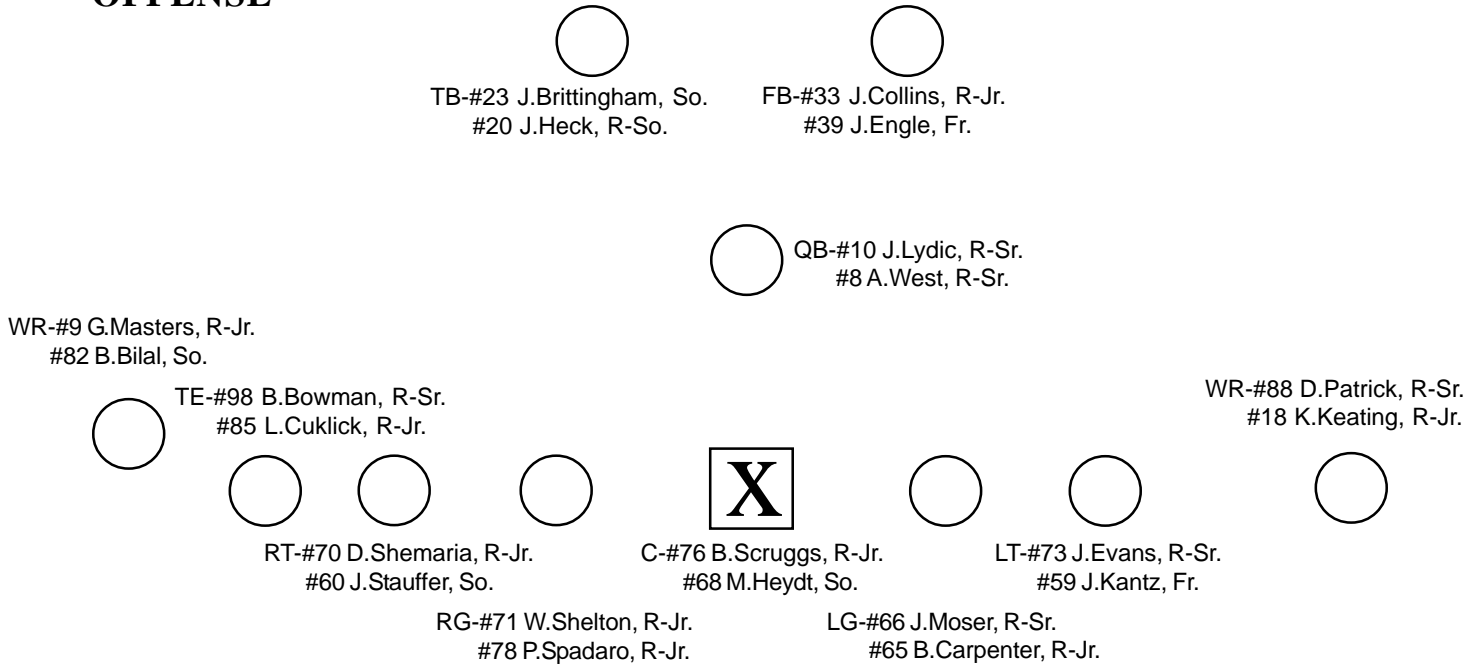
The Game

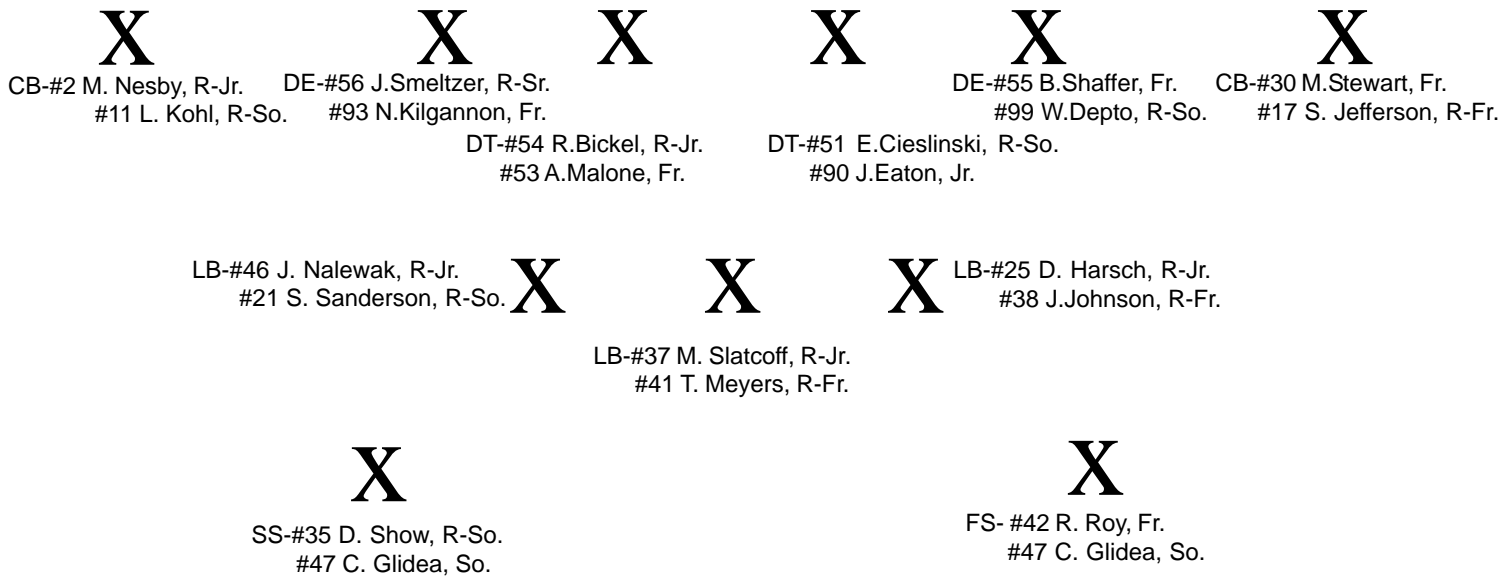

The Series

The Bald Eagles have battled to a draw in their all-time series, standing at a 39-39-3 record. The most recent meeting came last season in a 54-0 win for Bloomsburg. The most recent LHU victory came prior to that, a 17-15 squeaker at Hubert Jack Stadium in 2003. The last Bloomsburg win at Hubert Jack was in 2001.

Scouting the Huskies

Bloomsburg enters this contest on a three-game winning streak, taking wins from Slippery Rock University, Fairmont State University and Shippensburg University.

Sophomore tailback **Jamar Brittingham** is the top rusher in the PSAC, averaging 176 yards per game, and has reached paydirt eight times already in his three games. An excellent runner helps open up the passing game, as senior quarterback **Jack Lydic** has thrown for 589 yards with six scores and no interceptions. Classmate **Donny Patrick** is the team's top wideout, hauling in nine passes for 152 yards and a pair of scores.

The Huskies have played excellent defense this season, ranking fourth in the PSAC with 300.7 yards per-game in total yards. Sophomore line-backer **Rob Biernat** is the team's leading tackler with 23 stops, good for 22nd in the league. Classmate **Keith Davis** is the team's top defensive back, bringing three interceptions.

Bloom Head Coach Danny Hale

Danny Hale will begin his 13th season leading the Huskies' football program. Hale had a previous five-year coaching tenure at West Chester. Hale has a record of 95-38-1 (.712) at Bloomsburg and is ranked in the top 10 among active coaches on the all-time NCAA Division II winning percentage list with a career record of 135-51-1 (.724).

Hale was named the 2001 PSAC East Coach of the Year for the eighth time in his career along with picking up the American Football Coaches' Association (AFCA) Division II District I Coach of the Year for the seventh time. Following the 2000 season when Hale led the Huskies to the NCAA Division II title game, he was named the AFCA Division II National Coach of the Year. That year Hale led Bloomsburg to a 12-3 record. Hale was also named the AFCA District 1 Coach of the Year and the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year for 2000.

Last Time out for the Huskies

Quarterback **Jack Lydic** threw for 297 yards and four touchdowns and tailback **Jamar Brittingham** gained 261 all-purpose yards and scored twice to lead Bloomsburg University (3-0) to a 49-21 win over Shippensburg University (1-2) Saturday afternoon.

Lydic's touchdown throws were for 33, 62, 34 and 25 yards and were one shy of the school-record he shares with several other Bloomsburg quarterbacks. Brittingham finished with 198 yards on the ground and had 63 yards in pass receptions.

The Huskies scored on the first drive of the game with Brittingham scored on a 10-yard run to cap a 12-play drive putting the home team in front 7-0.

Shippensburg tied the game just 15 seconds into the second period when Walter Crump scored on an 18-yard run to cap a 70-yard drive, then took a 14-7 later midway through the period when Tony Gomez hit Kyle Fogarty with a four yard scoring pass.

Last time against Bloomsburg...

Outgained in total yards 498-65, the Lock Haven University football team (1-3, 1-2 PSAC) fell to the Bloomsburg University Huskies (2-1, 2-1 PSAC) 54-0 today at Redman Stadium. LHU's loss gives Bloomsburg a 42-38-3 lead in the all-time series.

Senior standout runningback **Maurice Walker** had 14 carries for just 47 yards on the ground for the Bald Eagles. His counterparts, Mike Ceroli and Julius Brown, both hit the century mark at 156 and 122, respectively.

It was another back, freshman Jamar Brittingham, who broke the scoreless tie with a two-yard touchdown run at 10:07 left in the first, following with another four-yard touchdown in the second to put the Huskies up 13-0. Ceroli then added two touchdowns of his own, a 15 and two-yarder, to give Bloomsburg a four-score lead.

Quarterback Jack Lydic hit Luke Kucklick for another score with no time left to give the Huskies a 34-0 halftime tally.

Rob Biernat took LHU quarterback **Rob Kristiniak's (Flourtown/Springfield Township)** errant pass to paydirt in the third, with Ceroli adding his third touch and Brown adding one as well to make the final tally of 54-0 at the 2:01 mark in the third quarter.

In a bright spot, the LHU defensive backs picked off three passes of their own, as senior **Will Jones** grabbed one and junior **Matt Shealy (Rankin/Woodland Hills)** picked off two.

Last Time out for the Bald Eagles

Lock Haven University football head coach **John Klacik**'s opening comment at the post-game press conference said it all for tonight's (Sept. 10) game.

"I'm glad we don't play another Division I-AA team next week," he said.

The last two weeks have been tough on the Bald Eagle squad (1-2) capped by a 70-0 loss at the hands of Towson University (2-0). Forced to play without their top two quarterbacks and their top two wide receivers, LHU mounted little offense, repeatedly forcing the Bald Eagle defense into tough spots.

The contest started out with some promise. After an interception on the first series for LHU resulted in a seven-yard rushing touchdown for Towson, the Bald Eagles were forced to punt.

On that Tiger possession, sophomore **David Show (Mill Run, Pa./Connellsville)** blitzed the TU quarterback, Sean Schaefer, popping the ball loose. Junior **Ryan Shaffer (DuBois, Pa./DuBois Area)** snatched the ball from mid-air, rumbling his way to the 12-yard line, a 23-yard interception return for the defensive tackle.

The next three plays set up for a 27-yard field goal, unfortunately missing wide left. That would be the Bald Eagles' best scoring opportunity of the game, as they would fall victim to the strong Towson run game to the tune of a three-touchdown, 134-yard first quarter and a 21-0 deficit.

More of the same in the second frame, as third-string tailback Eugene King would find the end-zone three times and Schaefer would pass for one as Towson would enter halftime up 56-0.

"I knew we'd be challenged tonight," said Klacik. "Going into halftime I just wanted our guys to keep their heads up and keep fighting for the rest of the game. I'm proud that they were able to do that."

The third quarter was indeed the best for the Bald Eagles, only a 7-0 loss on a passing score by backup quarterback Andrew Goldbeck.

The Bald Eagles had a new but familiar face at quarterback themselves in the third quarter, as junior **Brian Camberg (Altoona, Pa./Altoona Area)** made his first appearance behind center, forced back into a signal-

calling role from his tight end spot by the injuries to the LHU QB ranks. Camberg ended on a 6-of-10 performance for 48 yards.

Classmate **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** and freshman **William Pryor (Baltimore/City College)** made their presences known in the second half as well, moving the chains a few times on the ground. Pryor led all LHU rushers with 22 yards on four tries, while Marshall was close behind at 21 yards on four carries.

The Tigers got one more score late for the 70-0 final.

Breakin' Records

~ Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman** booted one field goal in the 17-16 win over Cheyney, giving him 18 three-pointers in his career. Hagerman is tied with **Rich Mariott (1991)** for second place in the LHU record books, just six off the pace set by **Matt Mapes (2000)**.

~ Hagerman also made a pair of PATs, giving him 33 in his career, good for eighth on the list. Mapes and **Dan Young (1982)** stand next on the list at 35, while the all-time leader is **Charles Traber (1986)** at 71.

~ Junior wideout **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** has 11 career touchdown catches, putting him 10th after just two years as a Bald Eagle. Three receivers (**Jeremy Burkett (1998)**, **Jon Spinosa (1995)** and **Tommy Allen (1972)**) are all poised at 12 TD grabs, while **Marcus Burkley (2003)** leads the list with 19.

2005 Bald Eagle Game Recaps

CHEYNEY, Pa. – Junior tailback **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** has not attempted a pass in his three years at Lock Haven University, until today (Aug. 27). Marshall threw his first pass in the most crucial of situations—down six with less than two minutes left – hitting sophomore wideout **Adam Lawrence (Hanover, Pa./Shippensburg University)** in the end zone for the 17-16 win at Cheyney University.

First-year head coach **John Klacik's** first game was defensive-minded in the first half, coming to a close at a scoreless tie. Both teams had managed just 162 total yards by halftime, punting a total of 11 times in the first two quarters.

“The thing that stuck out to our staff was that the team didn’t quit,” said Klacik. “It was a back-and-forth game, especially in the fourth quarter, and there were times when things weren’t going our way. But our kids never gave up.”

The Bald Eagles had two scoring opportunities dashed in the second quarter, ended by a fumble and a missed field goal try. Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman (Scottdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** redeemed himself by breaking the 0-0 game just shy of 40 minutes in with a 43-yard blast for the 3-0 lead.

After the Bald Eagle defense held the Wolves to a punt, a second fumble gave Cheyney the ball at the Lock Haven 31. Three plays later, Cheyney’s John Riley tied the score again with a 46-yard kick.

On Cheyney’s next possession, a pair of Billy Mitchell runs of 12 and 28 yards set up the defense for a 45-yard touchdown pass hauled in by Dominique Curry, tiptoeing down the sideline, as the Bald Eagles found themselves down for the first time of the game.

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Faced with the daunting task of being the Division I-AA National Champions' opening opponent, the Lock Haven University football squad (1-1) lost to James Madison University (1-0) tonight (Sept. 3) 56-0.

Falling victim to the big play, the Bald Eagles controlled the first and third quarters, surrounded by some breakdowns in both the second and fourth frames.

"I knew it would be a tough task to come in here, playing the defending champs at their home site," said LHU head coach **John Klacik**. "Our main goal was to be a better football team when we left this building tonight, and I'm proud of our guys that we accomplished that."

Largest season-opening crowd in JMU football history

TOWSON, Md. – Lock Haven University football head coach **John Klacik**'s opening comment at the post-game press conference said it all for tonight's (Sept. 10) game.

"I'm glad we don't play another Division I-AA team next week," he said.

The last two weeks have been tough on the Bald Eagle squad (1-2) capped by a 70-0 loss at the hands of Towson University (2-0) tonight. Forced to play without their top two quarterbacks and their top two wide receivers, LHU mounted little offense, repeatedly forcing the Bald Eagle defense into tough spots.

The contest started out with some promise. After an interception on the first series for LHU resulted in a seven-yard rushing touchdown for Towson, the Bald Eagles were forced to punt.

On that Tiger possession, sophomore **David Show (Mill Run, Pa./Connellsville)** blitzed the TU quarterback, Sean Schaefer, popping the ball loose. Junior **Ryan Shaffer (DuBois, Pa./DuBois Area)** snatched the ball from mid-air, rumbling his way to the 12-yard line, a 23-yard interception return for the defensive tackle.

The next three plays set up for a 27-yard field goal, missing wide left. That was LHU's best scoring opportunity of the game, as they would fall victim to the strong Towson run game to the tune of a three-touchdown, 134-yard first quarter and a 21-0 deficit.
