Bringing with him 17 years of Division I and I-AA coaching experience, **John Klacik** was named Lock Haven University head football coach, university administration announced March 8. Klacik served most recently as offensive coordinator/offensive line coach at Youngstown State University.

Klacik, an LHU alum, has spent all but one season of his coaching career at YSU, and was a part of four NCAA I-AA National Championship teams. He started with the Penguins as tight ends coach, working his way up the ladder through the offense, moving to wide receivers, quarterbacks, offensive line and then as offensive coordinator for the last four seasons. Klacik worked under current Ohio State University head coach Jim Tressel for 12 years.

He also spent the 2000 season at Division I Wake Forest University, working with the quarterbacks before returning to YSU in his most recent role.

A standout wide receiver, Klacik graduated with a bachelors degree in sports/fitness management from LHU in 1988. He led the Bald Eagles in receiving yards in each of his four seasons at the Haven, ranking eighth in school history with 1,976 career yards.

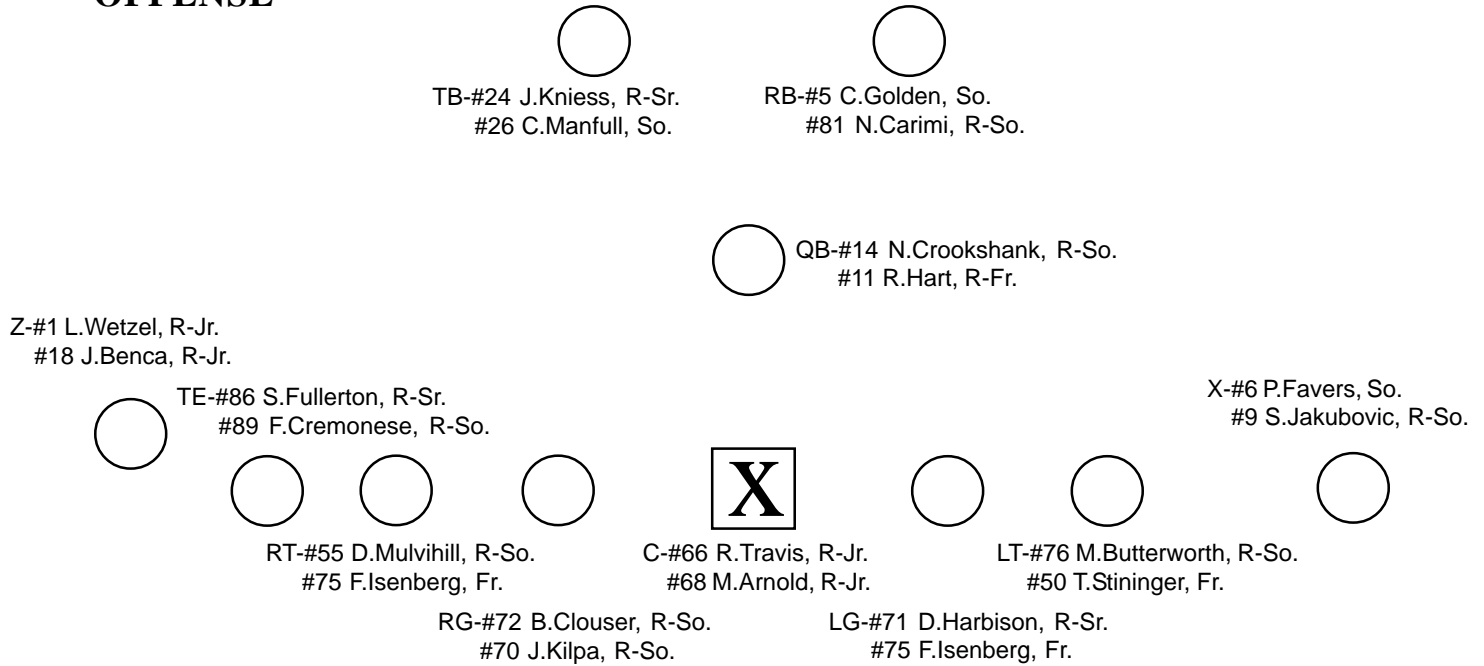

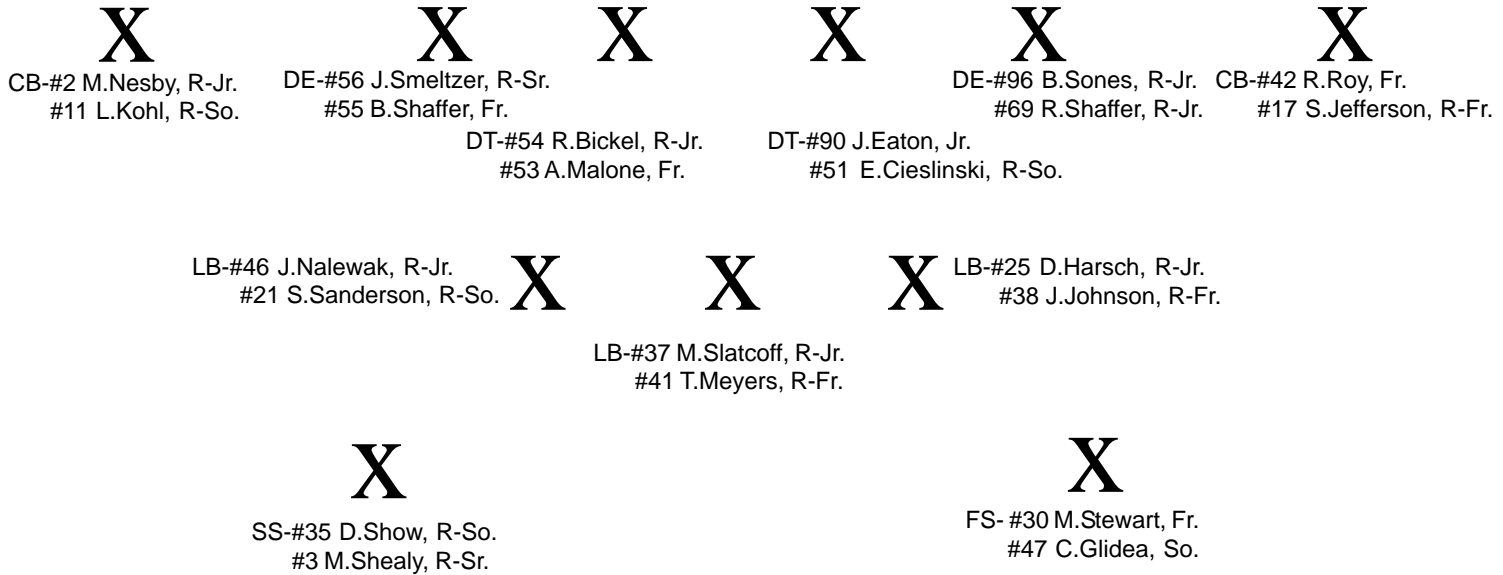

The most recent meeting came last season in a 31-3 win for the Rock. The most recent LHU victory came in 1980, a 29-7 tally.

Scouting the Rock

Slippery Rock enters this week on a three-game slide, due largely in part to tough competition. The Rock lost contests at Bloomsburg University and former home of LHU head coach **John Klacik**, Division I-AA Youngstown State University before dropping a home contest to Shepard University. All three opponents are undefeated in 2005.

SRU ranks near the bottom in the PSAC in both offensive (13) and defensive scoring (12), and is led in the rush game by sophomore Corey Manfull, averaging 72.3 yards per game, good for ninth in the conference. SRU signal-caller Nate Crookshank averages 178.7 yards through the air, his main target being sophomore wideout Paul Favers.

The defense is paced by junior strong safety Brandon Raszawski, hitting at 9.3 tackles per contest. Just behind the safety is Jared Palmer, making 8.3 tackles from his outside linebacker spot.

SRU Head Coach Dr. George Mihalik

Dr. George Mihalik has been good medicine for Rock football. At 53, Mihalik enters the 2004 season ranked No. 2 in career wins at SRU with a 111-61-4 record. He begins his 34th season as a part of The Rock football program and 18th season as SRU's head coach.

These impressive stats are the result of brains and values. Mihalik is a member of an elite group of collegiate head coaches in the nation to own a doctorate degree. He received an Ed. D. in Safety Management from West Virginia University in 1986. His bachelor's and master's degrees are from SRU.

Mihalik ranks fourth among active Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) head coaches in career wins. He ranks 18th nationally in both career wins and career winning percentage.

Last Time out for the Rock

The Rock football team wasted no time jumping on the scoreboard, scoring a touchdown on their first drive on a 45 yard pass from Nate Crookshank to Paul Favers with 13:06 remaining in the first quarter. But four Rock turnovers proved costly throughout the game, with the Shepherd coming away with a 24-7 win.

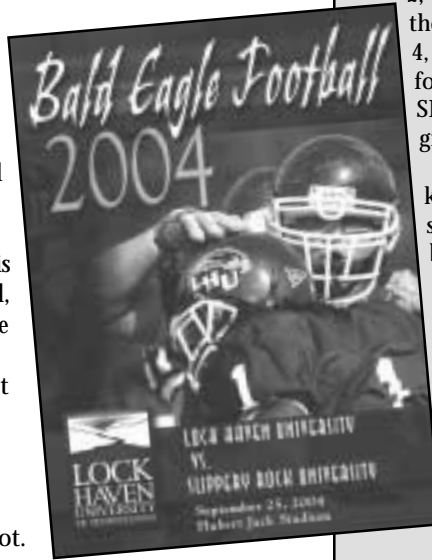
The Rock defense held the visiting Rams scoreless until late in the second quarter when Dervon Wallace scored on a four yard touchdown run. Shepherd would score again with three seconds left in the half, on a one yard touchdown run by Wallace.

The Rock didn't fare much better in the second half, with Shepherd scoring a field goal late in the third quarter and tacking on an additional touchdown off of a Crookshank interception with five minutes remaining in the game.

The Rock was led by sophomore running back Corey Manfull. Manfull rushed for 123 yards on 19 carries, averaging 6.3 yards per carry for the game. Crookshank finished the game 8 of 21 for 91 yards passing and two interceptions. The Rock receivers were led by Favers, who hauled in four passes for 58 yards.

Defensively, The Rock was led by redshirted junior Brandon Raszawski, who recorded 11 solo tackles and three assisted tackles.

Senior linebacker Jerome Whiting also tallied eight tackles for the game,



Last time against Slippery Rock...

LOCK HAVEN, Pa. – Plagued by turnovers and a potent Slippery Rock (3-2, 1-0 PSAC West) rushing attack, the Lock Haven football team (1-4, 0-1 PSAC West) dropped their fourth game in a row, losing to SRU 31-3. The Haven lost the ground battle 236-109.

The Rock took the opening kickoff and marched 68 yards in six plays for a touchdown, the big strike coming on Josh Kniess's 34-yard touchdown run. SRU began a drive in the first quarter that ended in paydirt at the 14:51 mark in the second, a 11-yard Nate Crookshank to Valdez Hails pass.

Lock Haven battled back, as **Tim Storino**, starting for the first time in nearly a year, caught fire midway through the second period, hitting **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** for a big 24-yard gain, eventually setting up a **Dan Hagerman (Scottdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** 35-yard field goal, cutting the lead 14-3.

Kniess added his second touchdown at the 1:36 mark to create a 21-3 halftime advantage. Lock Haven had the chance to add another Hagerman field goal with no time left in the half, but it was blocked, preserving the 18-point lead.

The second half was all the Rock, as Kniess added his third touchdown on a 7-yard rush and Ryan Daniel tacked on a 42-yard field goal for the 31-3 final.

while senior lineman Robert Minnie blocked two field goal attempts and recorded three tackles.

Last Time out for the Bald Eagles

Set up by the turnover bug and knocked down by a stellar run game, the Lock Haven football squad (1-3) dropped a difficult decision to Bloomsburg (4-0), 63-0 Sept. 17 at Hubert Jack Stadium.

The Huskies wasted little time putting points on the board, getting the opening kickoff and finishing a four-play 62-yard drive with a Jamar Brittingham touchdown.

"When you play a good football team, you can't afford to make mistakes," said LHU head coach **John Klacik**. "The scoreboard doesn't reflect the effort this team put into the game, it only shows how quickly mistakes can take you out of a contest."

Turnovers hit the Bald Eagles from the very start, as the opening exchange was fumbled on the ensuing drive, setting up for another Brittingham TD. The top rusher in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC), Brittingham finished with 119 yards on seven carries with three touchdowns.

Bloom put up four scores in the first quarter, and 42 points in the first half en route to their rout.

A former quarterback converted to tight end in the preseason and brought back to quarterback due to injuries, junior **Brian Camberg (Altoona, Pa./Altoona Area)** got his first start of the season. The big right-hander went 15-of-27 for 113 yards but an unfortunate two interceptions, one of which coming on a tipped ball out of the hands of junior tight end **Jason Walther (Elizabethtown, Pa./Elizabethtown)**.

The run game couldn't combat Bloomsburg's 372-yard, eight touchdown effort, as the Bald Eagles managed just 12 rushing yards on 22 carries.

The Bald Eagles had a pair of scoring opportunities in the second half. In the third quarter, after a 49-yard kickoff return by junior **Mike Nesby (Rankin, Pa./Woodland Hills)**, a six-play 55-yard drive ended with a missed 44-yard field goal off the foot of **Dan Hagerman (Scottsdale, Pa./Southmoreland)**.

With time ticking late in the fourth quarter, another good kickoff return—this time a 45-yard scamper by junior **Chelstan C. Anderson II (Halifax, Pa./Halifax)** and three completed passes by Camberg, the

Bald Eagles had a first-and-goal situation from the 10. Two rushes and a completed pass couldn't get LHU any closer than the five, as the fourth-down passing attempt to senior **Kellen Bush (Pittsburgh/Penn Hills)** was out of bounds.

On the defensive side, junior safety **David Show (Mill Run, Pa./Connellsville)** led LHU in tackles for the second-straight contest, making 11 total stops. Junior defensive end **Brad Sones (Elysburg, Pa./Southern Columbia)** was second on the squad with seven tackles, including a team-high 2.5 for loss.

Breakin' Records

~ Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman** booted one field goal in the 17-16 win over Cheyney, giving him 18 three-pointers in his career. Hagerman is tied with **Rich Mariott (1991)** for second place in the LHU record books, just six off the pace set by **Matt Mapes (2000)**.

~ Hagerman also made a pair of PATs, giving him 33 in his career, good for eighth on the list. Mapes and **Dan Young (1982)** stand next on the list at 35, while the all-time leader is **Charles Traber (1986)** at 71.

~ Junior wideout **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** has 11 career touchdown catches, putting him 10th after just two years as a Bald Eagle. Three receivers (**Jeremy Burkett (1998)**, **Jon Spinosa (1995)** and **Tommy Allen (1972)**) are all poised at 12 TD grabs, while **Marcus Burkley (2003)** leads the list with 19.

2005 Bald Eagle Game Recaps

CHEYNEY, Pa. – Junior tailback **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** has not attempted a pass in his three years at Lock Haven University, until today (Aug. 27). Marshall threw his first pass in the most crucial of situations—down six with less than two minutes left – hitting sophomore wideout **Adam Lawrence (Hanover, Pa./Shippensburg University)** in the end zone for the 17-16 win at Cheyney University.

First-year head coach **John Klacik's** first game was defensive-minded in the first half, coming to a close at a scoreless tie. Both teams had managed just 162 total yards by halftime, punting a total of 11 times in the first two quarters.

“The thing that stuck out to our staff was that the team didn’t quit,” said Klacik. “It was a back-and-forth game, especially in the fourth quarter, and there were times when things weren’t going our way. But our kids never gave up.”

The Bald Eagles had two scoring opportunities dashed in the second quarter, ended by a fumble and a missed field goal try. Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman (Scottdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** redeemed himself by breaking the 0-0 game just shy of 40 minutes in with a 43-yard blast for the 3-0 lead.

After the Bald Eagle defense held the Wolves to a punt, a second fumble gave Cheyney the ball at the Lock Haven 31. Three plays later, Cheyney’s John Riley tied the score again with a 46-yard kick.

On Cheyney’s next possession, a pair of Billy Mitchell runs of 12 and 28 yards set up the defense for a 45-yard touchdown pass hauled in by Dominique Curry, tiptoeing down the sideline, as the Bald Eagles found themselves down for the first time of the game.

Largest season-opening crowd in JMU football history

TOWSON, Md. – Lock Haven University football head coach **John Klacik**'s opening comment at the post-game press conference said it all for tonight's (Sept. 10) game.

"I'm glad we don't play another Division I-AA team next week," he said.

The last two weeks have been tough on the Bald Eagle squad (1-2) capped by a 70-0 loss at the hands of Towson University (2-0) tonight. Forced to play without their top two quarterbacks and their top two wide receivers, LHU mounted little offense, repeatedly forcing the Bald Eagle defense into tough spots.

The contest started out with some promise. After an interception on the first series for LHU resulted in a seven-yard rushing touchdown for Towson, the Bald Eagles were forced to punt.

On that Tiger possession, sophomore **David Show (Mill Run, Pa./Connellsville)** blitzed the TU quarterback, Sean Schaefer, popping the ball loose. Junior **Ryan Shaffer (DuBois, Pa./DuBois Area)** snatched the ball from mid-air, rumbling his way to the 12-yard line, a 23-yard interception return for the defensive tackle.

The next three plays set up for a 27-yard field goal, missing wide left. That was LHU's best scoring opportunity of the game, as they would fall victim to the strong Towson run game to the tune of a three-touchdown, 134-yard first quarter and a 21-0 deficit.
