Bringing with him 17 years of Division I and I-AA coaching experience, **John Klacik** was named Lock Haven University head football coach, university administration announced March 8. Klacik served most recently as offensive coordinator/offensive line coach at Youngstown State University.

Klacik, an LHU alum, has spent all but one season of his coaching career at YSU, and was a part of four NCAA I-AA National Championship teams. He started with the Penguins as tight ends coach, working his way up the ladder through the offense, moving to wide receivers, quarterbacks, offensive line and then as offensive coordinator for the last four seasons. Klacik worked under current Ohio State University head coach Jim Tressel for 12 years.

He also spent the 2000 season at Division I Wake Forest University, working with the quarterbacks before returning to YSU in his most recent role.

A standout wide receiver, Klacik graduated with a bachelors degree in sports/fitness management from LHU in 1988. He led the Bald Eagles in receiving yards in each of his four seasons at the Haven, ranking eighth in school history with 1,976 career yards.

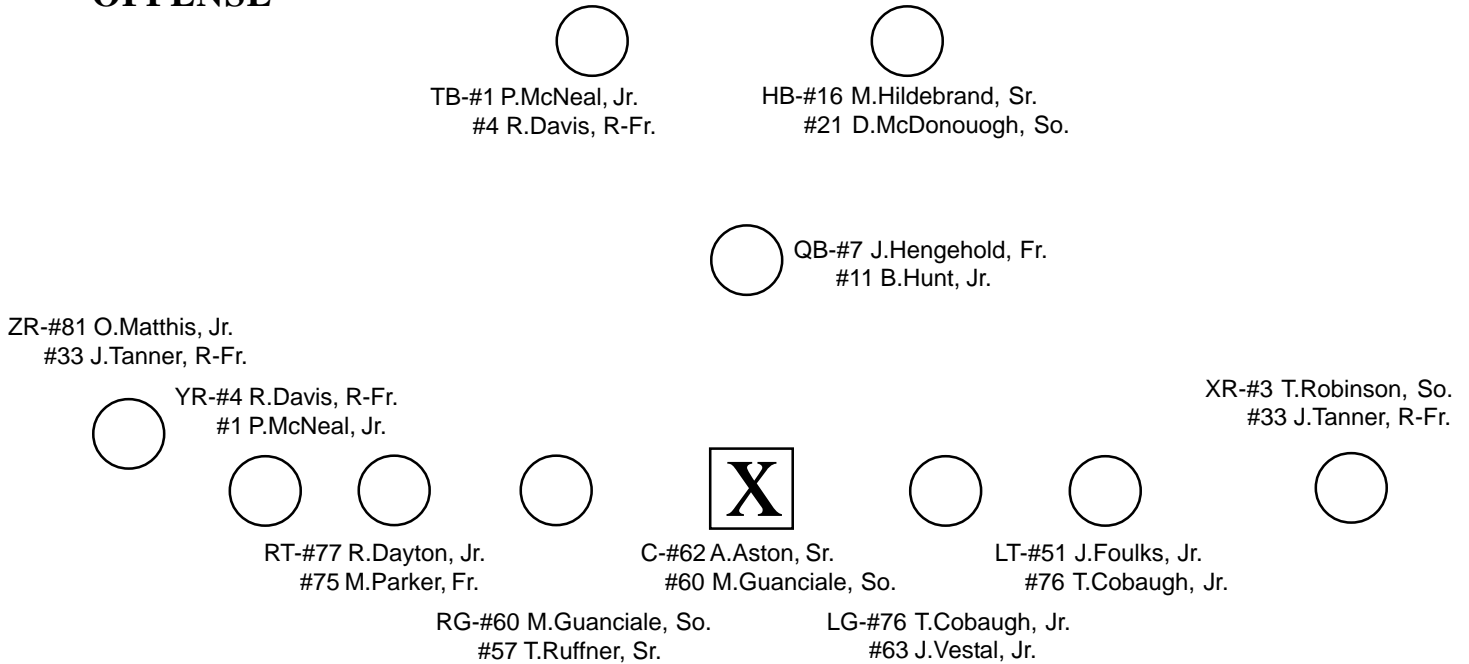

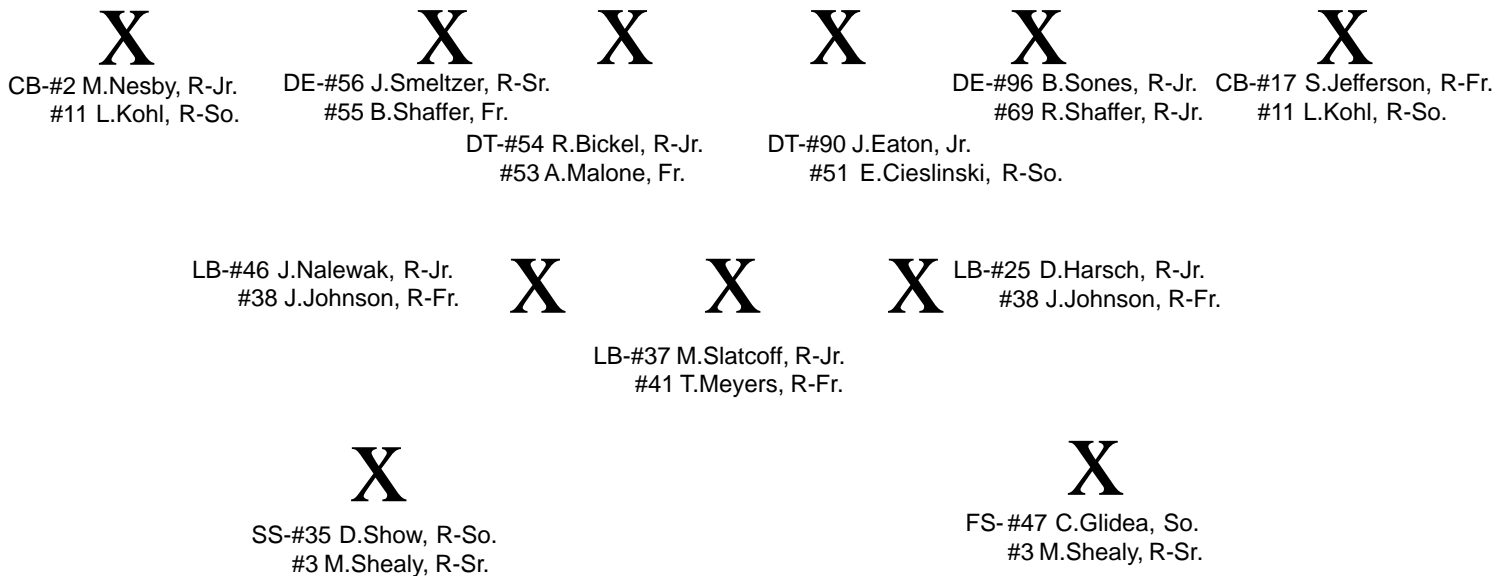

Scouting the Mountaineers

Mansfield enters this week's contest on a four-game slide to start the season. Including a loss in their first conference contest 45-18 to Kutztown University last weekend.

Junior tailback Poohbear McNeal looks to be regaining his standout freshman-season form, already posting 427 yards and three scores. John Hengehold is the top Mountaineer passer, with 760 yards and six touchdowns. His main target has been Rodney Davis, good for 16 catches and 223 yards with two touchdowns. Wideout Ozzie Mathis has made eight grabs, reaching the end zone in two of those catches.

Pacing the defensive squad for Mansfield are linebacker Andre Turner and cornerback Ronnie Montgomery, each with 32 tackles. Montgomery has each of the team's two interceptions this season.

Mansfield Head Coach Jim Shiffer

Jim Shiffer is entering his second season as the head football coach for the Mountaineers.

Shiffer returned home to his Mansfield roots when he was introduced as the 22nd Head Coach in the Mountaineers 112-year football history by President John Halstead during a news conference on January 30, 2004.

A three-year starter on the offensive line for the Mountaineers from 1986-88, Shiffer became the first alumnus to direct the Red & Black since former NFL Canton Bulldog Ed Russell guided his last team 75 years ago.

The personable Shiffer returns to Mansfield after a successful career that included stops at Yale University, the University of Pittsburgh, Millersville University and Kutztown University.

Last Time out for the Mountaineers

Dave Murzynski's one-yard plunge with 22 seconds remaining capped off a 73-yard drive in the final two minutes to send Mansfield to a heartbreaking 15-12 loss in a PSAC cross-over contest Saturday night, Sept. 17, at Memorial Stadium.

"I couldn't be prouder of these players than I am tonight," said head coach Jim Shiffer, "They played their hearts out for 60 minutes and deserved better. They (Clarion) may have scored on our defense in the last two minutes, but that defense kept them off the board for the first 58 minutes. And that was an outstanding effort by that group of guys."

The Mountaineer defense, much maligned after giving up a school record 88 points to California, played with inspiration and confidence in a remarkable turnaround throughout the game.

After a scoreless first quarter, Clarion managed to get on the score board when Matt Morris picked up a blocked punt and returned it 2 yards for a touchdown. The extra point was good, giving Clarion a 7-0 lead with 8:30 remaining in the first half.

Mansfield came out of the locker room fired up and the defense held Clarion to a three and out in the first series of the second half. The Mountaineers took over on their own 49 yard line and benefited from three straight encroachment penalties called on Clarion. Junior Ozzie Mathis then out-leaped a defender in the right hand corner of the end zone to pull down a 30 yard touchdown pass from quarterback John Hengehold. The extra point attempt was blocked, and Mansfield trailed 7-6 at 12:25 mark of the third quarter.

The Mountaineers took their first lead of the season midway through the fourth quarter when Hengehold hit Tyrone Robinson over the middle and Robinson outran three defenders for a 46 yard touchdown. The Mountaineers were stopped on the two-point conversion try, but took a 12-7 lead.

The Mountaineers looked as if they had the game in hand when they started a drive from their own 34 yard line and covered 47 yards while eating up 4:26 on the clock. The drive was highlighted by Poohbear McNeal's 42

Last time against Mansfield...

MANSFIELD, Pa. – Key penalties and big-play strikes from both the running and passing games helped the Lock Haven University football team (2-4, 0-1 PSAC West) get their first win in five games. The offense clicked on all cylinders, as **Maurice Walker** ran for 149 yards and a game-winning touchdown and **Tim Storino** threw for 310 yards and two scores.

Lock Haven took an early advantage, as Storino capped a 12-play, 78-yard drive with a 23-yard strike to **Adam Lawrence (Hanover, Pa./Delone Catholic)**. On a drive that started at the end of the first quarter, highlighted by four Walker gains, sophomore kicker **Dan Hagerman (Scottdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** increased the LHU lead by three with a 40-yard field goal his longest kick of the season.

Perhaps resting on their 10-point laurels, the kickoff coverage team allowed Ronnie Montomery a 100-yard kickoff return, a school-record trip, cutting the lead to 10-7.

After an LHU punt, Mountaineer quarterback Matt Hildebrand led his squad to gain their first lead, hitting a big 42-yard pass to Kody Crispell and an 11-yard touchdown to Joe Bennett to make it 13-10. Hagerman had a chance to tie the game at the end of the half, but missed a 44-yarder wide right.

Defenses took over for most of the third quarter, including an LHU interception by **Jonathan Nalewak (Shamokin, Pa./Shamokin Area)** at the Mansfield 48-yard line. LHU couldn't capitalize, eventually missing a 46-yard field goal.

yard run on a 3rd and 25. With just over 2 minutes to play, the Mountaineers attempted a 36 yard field goal that was blocked and recovered by Clarion at their own 30 with 2:07 to play.

Last Time out for the Bald Eagles

They scored. The Lock Haven football team (1-4, 0-1 PSAC West) had another tough loss Sept. 24 at the hands of Slippery Rock University (1-3, 1-0 PSAC West) but they put points on the board, 55-7.

With a couple new faces and a few old ones, the Bald Eagle football squad fought hard and couldn't combat the excellent running attack of the Rock, with two tailbacks scoring a pair of touchdowns apiece.

LHU took the opening kickoff for a seven-play 46-yard drive, aided by a couple penalties and strong running from junior **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** and freshman **John Kaluzny (Mill Hall, Pa./Central Mountain)**. The drive halted on downs at the SRU 36, and Rock tailback Josh Kniess took the first handoff 66 yards for a score.

On the next possession, freshman **Jason Eby (Ulster, Pa./Athens)** fumbled on a sack, turning it over for the 14-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown.

"The fumble recovery for a touchdown is what really took the wind out of our sails," head coach **John Klacik** said. "The effort was there, but we just didn't do the little things it takes to win."

Kaluzny topped all Bald Eagle carriers with a 15-carry 31-yard effort in his first chance in the backfield. Marshall chipped in with 21 yards on three carries. Eby finished the contest 11-of-27 for 48 yards and a pair of picks.

"Kaluzny had a great week of practice showing some things that we haven't seen any of our other backs do," Klacik added. "He showed flashes of that tonight, but we need him to do that a bit more."

The Bald Eagle score came late in the fourth off a special-teams play. A low snap in the end zone on a punt by SRU resulted in a short punt recovered by junior defensive end **Jeffery P. Eaton (Reading, Pa./Lackawanna J.C.)** on the SRU seven.

Three plays later, reserve quarterback **Corey Cicilioni (Lake Ariel, Pa./North Pocono)** made a three-yard TD rush for the team's first score in 15 quarters.

Breakin' Records

~ Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman** booted one field goal in the 17-16 win over Cheyney, giving him 18 three-pointers in his career. Hagerman is tied with **Rich Mariott (1991)** for second place in the LHU record books, just six off the pace set by **Matt Mapes (2000)**.

~ Hagerman also made a trio of PATs, giving him 34 in his career, good for eighth on the list. Mapes and **Dan Young (1982)** stand next on the list at 35, while the all-time leader is **Charles Traber (1986)** at 71.

~ Junior wideout **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** has 11 career touchdown catches, putting him 10th after just two years as a Bald Eagle. Three receivers (**Jeremy Burkett (1998)**, **Jon Spinosa (1995)** and **Tommy Allen (1972)**) are all poised at 12 TD grabs, while **Marcus Burkley (2003)** leads the list with 19.

"I'm glad we don't play another Division I-AA team next week," he said.

The last two weeks have been tough on the Bald Eagle squad (1-2) capped by a 70-0 loss at the hands of Towson University (2-0) tonight. LHU took the opening kickoff for a seven-play 46-yard drive, aided by a couple penalties and strong running from junior **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** and freshman **John Kaluzny (Mill Hall, Pa./Central Mountain)**. The drive halted on downs at the SRU 36, and Rock tailback Josh Kniess took the first handoff 66 yards for a score.

On the next possession, freshman **Jason Eby (Ulster, Pa./Athens)** fumbled on a sack, turning it over for the 14-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown.

“The fumble recovery for a touchdown is what really took the wind out of our sails,” head coach **John Klacik** said. “The effort was there, but we just didn’t do the little things it takes to win.” Kaluzny topped all Bald Eagle carriers with a 15-carry 31-yard effort in his first chance in the backfield. Marshall chipped in with 21 yards on three carries.
