Bringing with him 17 years of Division I and I-AA coaching experience, **John Klacik** was named Lock Haven University head football coach, university administration announced March 8. Klacik served most recently as offensive coordinator/offensive line coach at Youngstown State University.

Klacik, an LHU alum, has spent all but one season of his coaching career at YSU, and was a part of four NCAA I-AA National Championship teams. He started with the Penguins as tight ends coach, working his way up the ladder through the offense, moving to wide receivers, quarterbacks, offensive line and then as offensive coordinator for the last four seasons. Klacik worked under current Ohio State University head coach Jim Tressel for 12 years.

He also spent the 2000 season at Division I Wake Forest University, working with the quarterbacks before returning to YSU in his most recent role.

A standout wide receiver, Klacik graduated with a bachelors degree in sports/fitness management from LHU in 1988. He led the Bald Eagles in receiving yards in each of his four seasons at the Haven, ranking eighth in school history with 1,976 career yards.

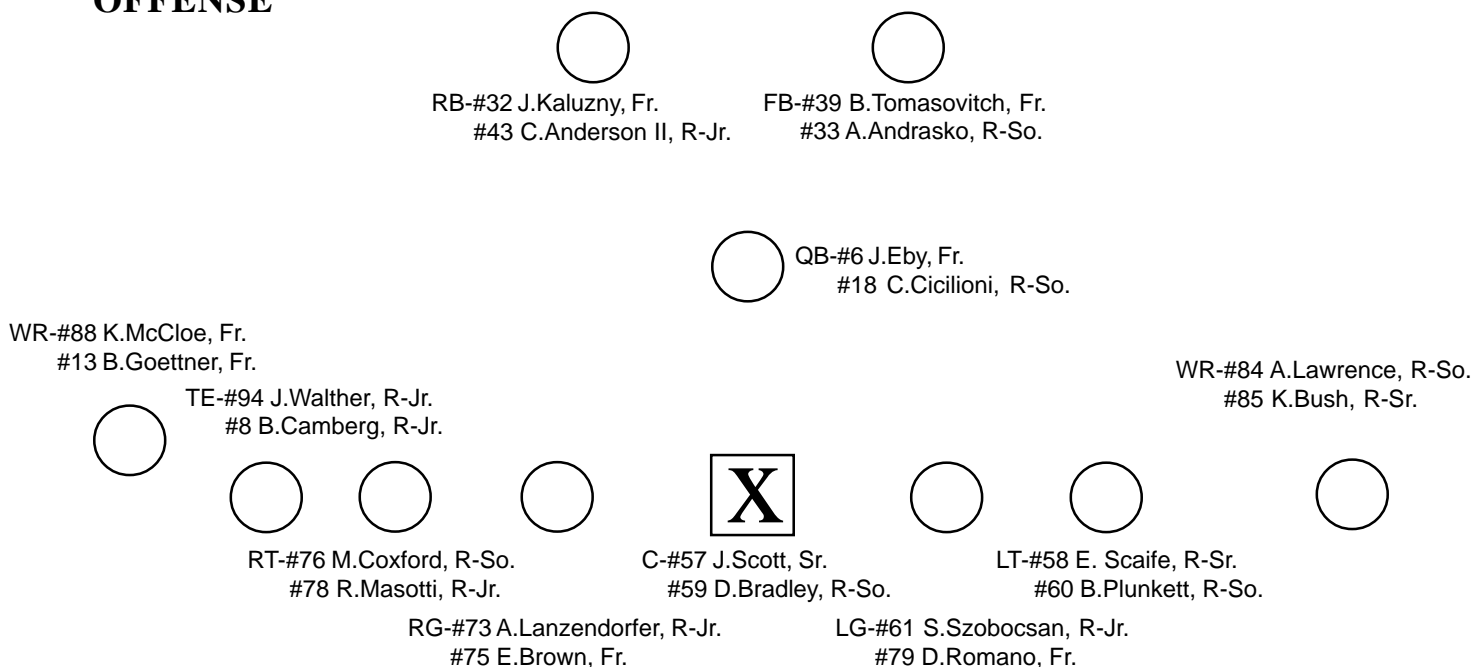
## The Game

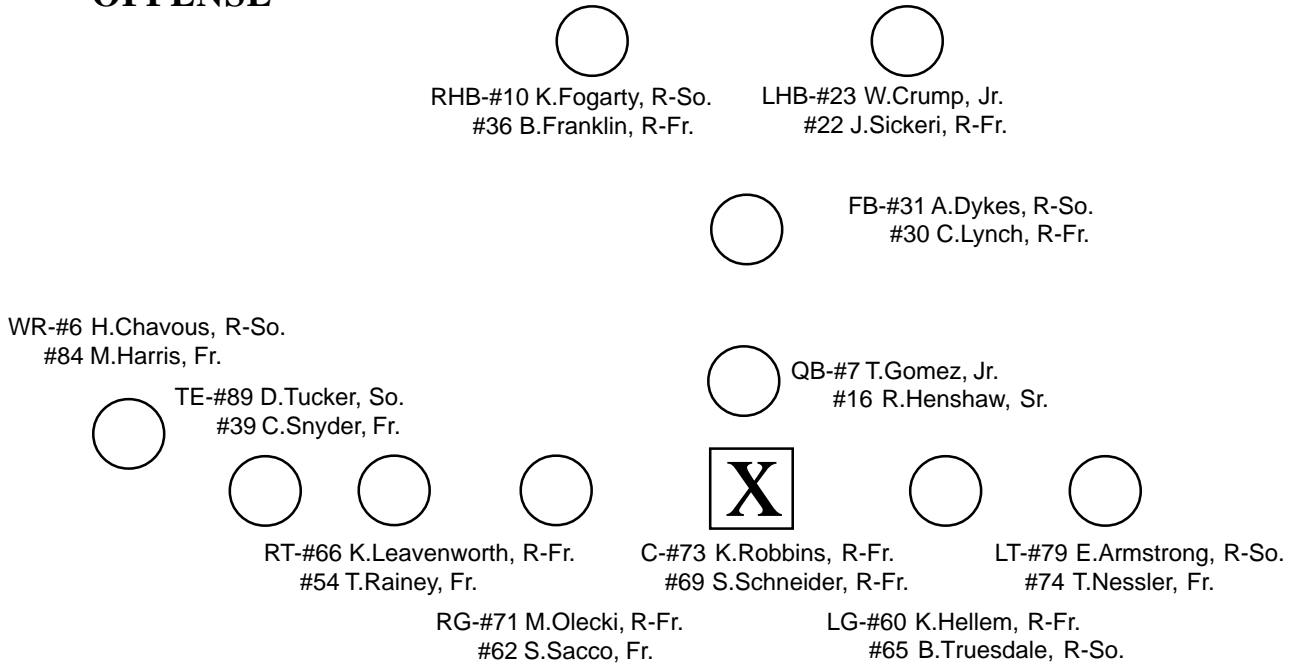

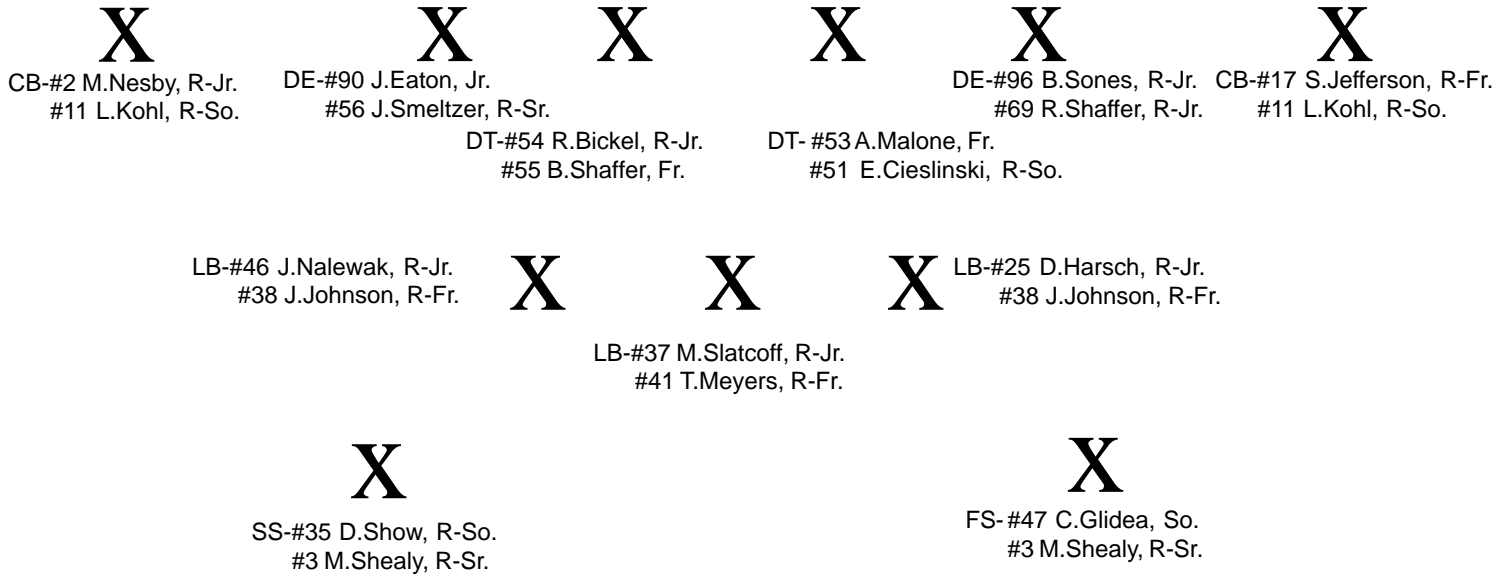

## The Series

Shippensburg has a 48-18-3 all-time advantage in the series, including a 45-7 victory at Shippensburg in 2004. LHU won most recent bout at Hubert Jack Stadium, a 26-13 game in 2002.

## Scouting the Red Raiders

Shippensburg invades LHU coming off a two-game conference slide, dropping games to Edinboro University and most recently IUP just one week ago. The Red Raider offense has a pair of dangerous receivers, as Walter Crump sits eighth in the PSAC with 3.83 catches per game, and his counterpart Howard Chavous is 10th with a 57.0 yards per game average.

Ship's Brent Grimes helps his team in the special teams battle, as he ranks first in the league with a 33.6 average return per kickoff, including one touchdown, and sits fifth at 10.0 per punt return. The senior cornerback has also picked off four passes.

On the defensive side, safety John Sharbaugh is third in the PSAC at 11.3 tackles per contest, aided by fellow safety Jonathan Aldridge at 8.8 stops per game.

## Shippensburg Head Coach Rocky Rees

William M. "Rocky" Rees has a long and distinguished career in football. In 2005, he enters his 16th season as the head coach of Shippensburg University, coming off his second playoff appearance as coach of the Red Raiders.

In 2004, Rees was named as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II Region 1 Coach of the Year for the second time in his career while earning his third Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Western Division Coach of the Year honor, adding to his honors in 1991 and 2001.

Returning a majority of his players from the previous season, Rees guided the 2004 Red Raiders to a 10-2 record and the title in the PSAC Western Division. For Shippensburg, it marked the most wins in 13 years, the seventh winning season in eight years, and the first playoff appearance for the school since 1991.

## Last Time out for the Red Raiders

A late touchdown run by Chris Morgan with 15 seconds remaining gave IUP its 18th consecutive victory over Shippensburg University, 20-15, at Seth Grove Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Red Raiders (2-4, 0-2 PSAC West), who led 12-0 with 6:12 remaining in the third quarter, started a drive at the IUP 41-yard line with 4:36 left in the game. Three plays into the drive, sophomore Aaron Dykes broke a 27-yard run that put the ball on the Indian 3-yard line, but the Red Raiders were unable to get the ball into the end zone.

Instead, sophomore Jamie Reder kicked a 23-yard field goal to give Shippensburg a 15-13 lead with 1:58 to play. With the exception of two blocked kicks, Reder has made his last 15-straight field goal attempts after missing the first two of his career a year ago in the season-opener against Kutztown University.

## Last Time out for the Bald Eagles

Power Off-Tackle. Out of the 74 run plays the Lock Haven University football squad (2-4, 0-1 PSAC West) had in their 24-12 win over Mansfield University (0-5, 0-1 PSAC East) today (Oct. 1), 61 were the power off-tackle.

"When your offensive line plays as tough as they did today," said LHU head coach **John Klacik**, "the backs have room to run and that transfers to a win."

The Mountaineers knew it was coming but couldn't do anything about it. Freshman **John Kaluzny (Mill Hall, Pa./Central Mountain)**, carrying

Last time against Shippensburg...

**SHIPPENSBURG, Pa.** – Stricken by the turnover bug and a balanced Red Raider offensive attack, the Lock Haven University football team (2-5, 0-2 PSAC West) fell victim to an angry No. 19 Shippensburg University squad (6-1, 2-1 PSAC West). LHU threw four interceptions en route to a 45-7 rout.

Scorned by their first loss of the season to IUP a week ago, the Red Raiders were a team on a mission today, scoring on five of their first seven possessions in the game and gaining 242 yards on the ground to go with 245 passing yards. While the LHU defense was at times porous, the offense never seemed to get on track either.

LHU signal caller **Tim Storino**, fresh off a 318-yard, three-touchdown performance at Mansfield University, coughed up four interceptions. Storino's first was returned by John Sharbaugh for a touchdown, the second pick came at the Shippensburg nine-yard line halting LHU's first potential scoring drive.

The third interception resulted in another Red Raider touchdown on a 17-yard pass to Pat Ferguson and while the fourth didn't result in a score, it came when the score was 31-0, and marked Storino's second-to-last drive at the helm of the Bald Eagle offense.

The highlight of the running game was sophomore **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois Area)**, who gained 28 yards on nine carries in mop-up duty.

The Bald Eagle offense showed signs of life late in the fourth quarter on a 13-play, 57-yard drive that ended with a **Rob Kristiniak (Flourtown, Pa./Springfield Township)** quarterback sneak for their lone touchdown.

the ball for just the second game this season, managed an impressive 39-carry 233-yard performance for the Bald Eagles, seconded by junior **Chelstan C. Anderson II's (Halifax, Pa./Halifax)** 145 yards and two touchdowns. As a team, the Bald Eagles rushed for 434 yards on 71 carries. Kaluzny's effort ranks fourth in LHU's single game record book.

A local star for the Central Mountain High School squad, Kaluzny had a few extra fans in the Homecoming crowd today.

"I had a lot of friends and family in the stands," he said. "and that really gave me a lift."

Mansfield started with the ball, getting into LHU territory before freshman **Ali Malone (Springfield, Va./Hayfield)** stripped the ball loose from MU's Rodney Davis.

Kaluzny got the call on the next eight plays, getting to the Mansfield 17-yard line before Anderson eventually recorded the six-yard touchdown run. LHU would end the first quarter with that 7-0 advantage.

"Scoring first gave our team a big lift," said senior guard **Steve Szobocsan (Bainbridge, Pa./Elizabethtown)**. "Then the defense went out there and made it stand up."

Early in the second stanza, the Bald Eagles picked up a key fourth-and-one situation on their own 40-yard line as punter **Dan Hagerman (Scottsdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** found quarterback **Troy Wile, Jr. (Fayetteville, Pa./Chambersburg)** for an 11-yard pass play. Three plays later, Anderson found paydirt again with a 31-yard rush.

Mansfield's tailback Poohbear McNeal brought the score to 14-6 at the half with a four-yard touchdown rush of his own.

Hagerman lined up for a school-record 47-yard field goal at the end of the half, falling just short.

The Bald Eagle defense forced their third turnover of the day on Mansfield's first possession of the second half, a fumble forced by **Derek Harsch (Wellsboro, Pa./Wellsboro Area)** and recovered by **Mike Slatcoff (Sandy Lake, Pa./Cochranon)** at the Mountaineer 35.

#### DO YOU CARE?

John Kaluzny and Chelstan C. Anderson II ran for 100 apiece in the win over Mansfield, the first time since Oct. 13, 2001 when Melvin Kirby and Maurice Walker did it against Cheyney.

After a handful of rushes, freshman fullback **Brian Tomasovitch (Throop, Pa./Mid Valley)** gave LHU a 21-6 lead with 8:27 left in the third.

Mansfield would answer with a 6-play 35-yard drive, capped by an excellent 24-yard TD pass from John Hengehold to Ozzie Mathis.

Keeping the ball on the ground once again, LHU would get a Hagerman 31-yard field goal for the 24-12 lead.

#### Breakin' Records

~ Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman** booted one field goal in the 24-12 win over Mansfield, giving him 19 three-pointers in his career, good for second place in the LHU record books, just five off the pace set by **Matt Mapes (2000)**.

~ Hagerman also made a trio of PATs, giving him 37 in his career, good for sixth on the list. **Dan Guers (1948)** stands next on the list at 41, while the all-time leader is **Charles Traber (1986)** at 71.

~ Junior wideout **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** has 11 career touchdown catches, putting him 10th after just two years as a Bald Eagle. Three receivers (**Jeremy Burkett (1998)**, **Jon Spinosa (1995)** and **Tommy Allen (1972)**) are all poised at 12 TD grabs, while **Marcus Burkley (2003)** leads the list with 19.

~ **John Kaluzny's** 233 rushing yards against Mansfield were the fourth-most in school history and the tops for a Bald Eagle freshman.

With a couple new faces and a few old ones, the Bald Eagle football squad fought hard and couldn’t combat the excellent running attack of the Rock, with two tailbacks scoring a pair of touchdowns apiece.

LHU took the opening kickoff for a seven-play 46-yard drive, aided by a couple penalties and strong running from junior **Derek Marshall (Luthersburg, Pa./DuBois)** and freshman **John Kaluzny (Mill Hall, Pa./Central Mountain)**. The drive halted on downs at the SRU 36, and Rock tailback Josh Kniess took the first handoff 66 yards for a score.

On the next possession, freshman **Jason Eby (Ulster, Pa./Athens)** fumbled on a sack, turning it over for the 14-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown.

“The fumble recovery for a touchdown is what really took the wind out of our sails,” head coach **John Klacik** said. “The effort was there, but we just didn’t do the little things it takes to win.” Kaluzny topped all Bald Eagle carriers with a 15-carry 31-yard effort in his first chance in the backfield. Marshall chipped in with 21 yards on three carries.
