Bringing with him 17 years of Division I and I-AA coaching experience, **John Klacik** was named Lock Haven University head football coach, university administration announced March 8. Klacik served most recently as offensive coordinator/offensive line coach at Youngstown State University.

Klacik, an LHU alum, has spent all but one season of his coaching career at YSU, and was a part of four NCAA I-AA National Championship teams. He started with the Penguins as tight ends coach, working his way up the ladder through the offense, moving to wide receivers, quarterbacks, offensive line and then as offensive coordinator for the last four seasons. Klacik worked under current Ohio State University head coach Jim Tressel for 12 years.

He also spent the 2000 season at Division I Wake Forest University, working with the quarterbacks before returning to YSU in his most recent role.

A standout wide receiver, Klacik graduated with a bachelors degree in sports/fitness management from LHU in 1988. He led the Bald Eagles in receiving yards in each of his four seasons at the Haven, ranking eighth in school history with 1,976 career yards.

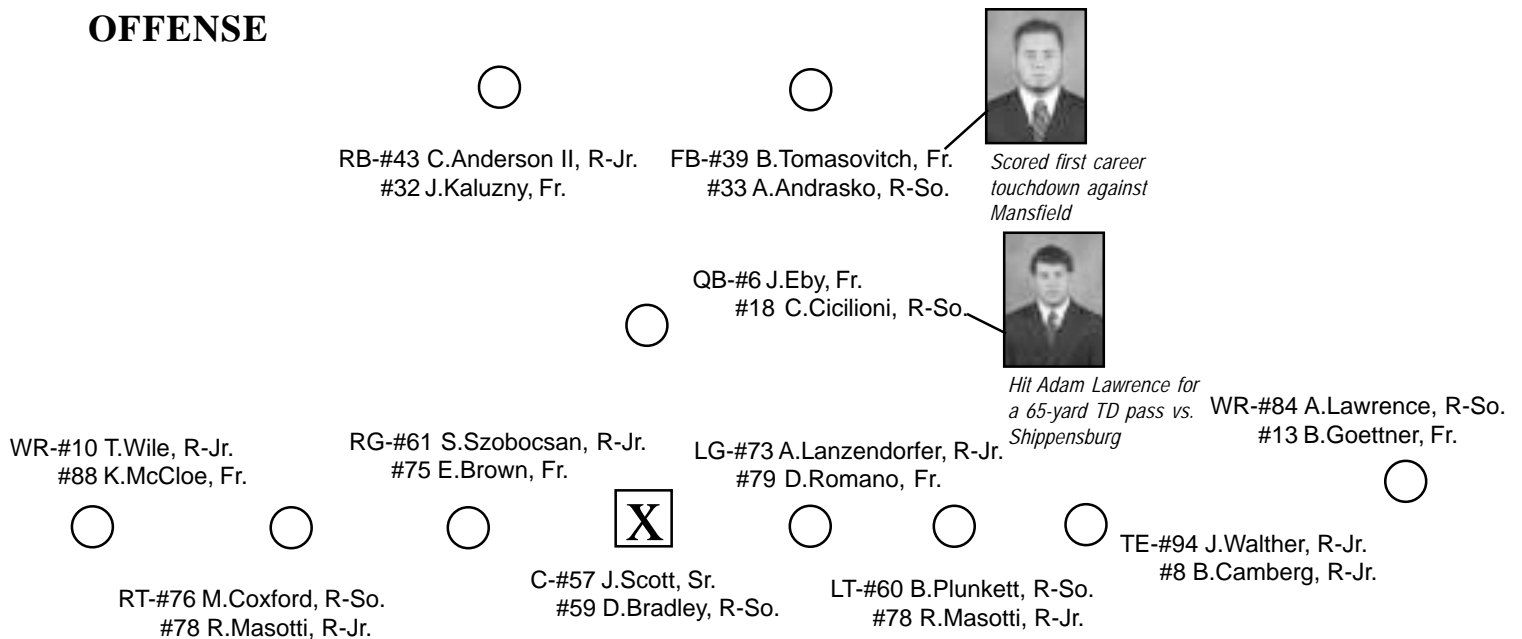
## The Game

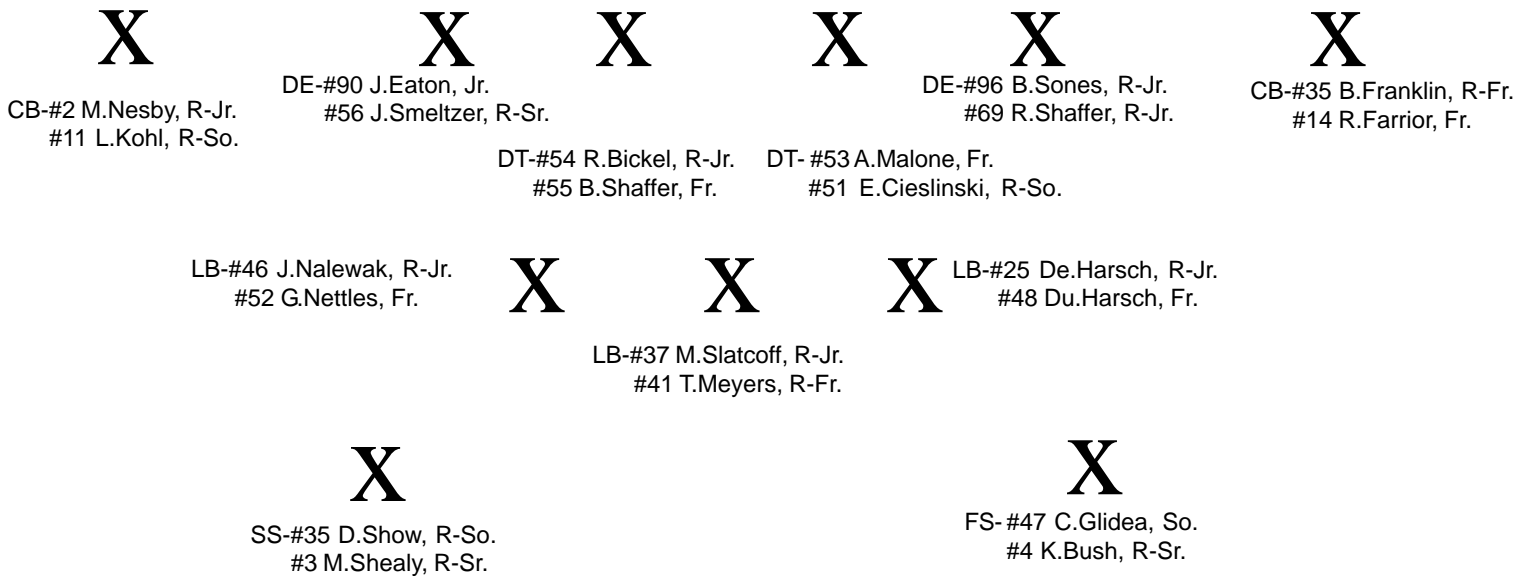

## The Series

Clarion has a 38-15-1 all-time advantage in the series, with Lock Haven taking a 16-13 overtime win last season. LHU has lost the last 11 meetings at Memorial Stadium in Clarion, Pa.

## Scouting the Golden Eagles

Clarion comes into the week on a three-game slide, including a pair of conference losses (Edinboro University and California University (Pa.)) as well as a 56-0 loss to East Stroudsburg University for the Golden Eagles' homecoming contest. Clarion has lost those three games by a total score of 143-7.

Junior Brandon Dando returns to the helm for Clarion, his major target coming in the form of Michael Byrd. Tyrone Buckner leads the ground attack with 266 yards and a pair of scores.

Junior linebacker Matt Morris leads all Eagle tacklers with 60, including a whopping 13 for loss. His tackles ranks third in the PSAC, while his TFL numbers put him tied for third with LHU defensive end **Brad Sones (Elysburg, Pa./Southern Columbia)**. Jordan Hicks gives Clarion a pair of top-10 tacklers with his 54 stops.

## Clarion Head Coach Malen Luke

Malen Luke, 51, an experienced and highly successful head football coach, was named Clarion's 10th head coach on December 28, 1993, and begins his 11th season at Clarion.

A dedicated, hard-working and fiercely competitive coach, Malen's teams always provide Golden Eagle football fans with an aggressive, disciplined and high-powered style.

In 10 years Luke's Golden Eagles have posted a 51-58 overall record, a 27-33 PSAC-West mark and have averaged nearly 30ppg and 400+ yards of offense over that time.

## Last Time out for the Golden Eagles

East Stroudsburg's Anthony Carfagno ran for 3 touchdowns and quarterback Jim Terwilliger passed for 347 yards and 2 td's to lead the #14 ranked Warriors to a 56-0 win over Clarion.

East Stroudsburg raised their overall record to 5-1, while Clarion dipped to 2-4 on the season.

The Clarion Homecoming Day crowd of 4,000 saw ESU score on six of eight first half possessions to jump out to a 42-0 lead at the intermission.

Anthony Carfagno scored in the first quarter on runs of 1 and 2 yards, then tacked on a 7-yard run with 13:51 to go in the second quarter to lead 21-0.

Terwilliger then tossed two td passes, the first a 75-yarder to Tim Strenfel and the second a 53-yard score to Evan Prall.

## Last Time out for the Bald Eagles

On a cold day giving Bald Eagle fans a preview of weather to come, key penalties and turnovers kept the Lock Haven University football team (2-5, 0-2 PSAC West) from getting their first conference victory today (Oct. 8) in a 26-7 loss to Shippensburg University (3-4, 1-2 PSAC West) at Hubert Jack Stadium.

The Raiders specialize in the Wing-T offense, a three running-back set that attempts to confuse with motion and relies on big rushing numbers. While the Bald Eagles were down 17-0 at the half, it had nothing to do with the powerful run game of Shippensburg.

Last time against Clarion...

**LOCK HAVEN, Pa.** – For the Lock Haven University (3-5, 1-2 PSAC West) defense's front seven that had allowed over 253 yards per game on the ground, the idea of squaring off against a Clarion University (3-5, 21-2 PSAC West)

rushing attack that averaged 170 yards per game looked to be a daunting task. The Bald Eagle defense rose to the challenge, allowing just 39 yards of total offense in the first half and amassing eight total tackles for loss, powering the team to a 16-13 overtime victory today at Hubert Jack Stadium.

Fullback **Travis Diehl** crossed the line for the overtime score, the first of his three-year career.

Both teams reached the half at a scoreless tie, but it wasn't through lack of opportunities for the Bald Eagles. Lock

Haven took the opening kickoff with a big 35-yard return by senior **Maurice Walker**.

On the very first play of the game, LHU's **Tim Storino** hit a streaking **Adam Lawrence (Hanover, Pa./Delone Catholic)** for 32 yards, where after three unsuccessful plays, **Dan Hagerman (Scottsdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** lined up for a 30-yard field goal attempt.

Hagerman's kick was blocked by Dwaon Woodard, thwarting the first of a few chances for the Haven to get on the scoreboard.

While the LHU defense was thinking run-first after a pair of first down rushes on the Raiders' first touch, quarterback Tony Gomez did a play-action rollout throwing a 38-yard floater of a pass that two Bald Eagles collided on to allow Ship wideout Kyle Fogarty a reception.

The Bald Eagle defense stepped it up in the red-zone, allowing just seven more yards on that drive, as the Raiders had to settle for a 24-yard field goal.

Later in the first quarter, freshman **Jason Eby (Ulster, Pa./Athens)** had a screen pass deflected at the line, into the waiting arms of Shippensburg's Brandon Cook for a 33-yard return and touchdown, a 10-0 lead for Ship.

A penalty killed the Bald Eagles' best scoring drive of the first quarter, as a seven-play 37-yard drive worked LHU to a fourth-and-five at the Ship 10-yard line. As the Bald Eagles lined up for a field goal, junior **Brian Camberg (Altoona, Pa./Altoona Area)** took the ball around the left side on a fake, picking up the first down and then pitching to junior kicker **Dan Hagerman (Scottsdale, Pa./Southmoreland)** for the touchdown. The play was called back however, as Hagerman had worked his way in front of Camberg to receive the illegal forward pass and LHU turned it over on downs.

With 13:59 left in the second quarter, sophomore **Adam Lawrence (Hanover, Pa./Shippensburg University)** made a darting 56-yard punt return for a touchdown, but this score was too called back after an illegal block in the back by the Bald Eagles.

Another breakdown on the pass defense allowed for a 17-0 Ship lead at the half, as Gomez hit Howard Chavous for a 44-yard TD strike with 7:58 left in the half.

Later in the third, LHU broke onto the scoreboard with a 65-yard connection from sophomore **Corey Cicilioni (Lake Ariel, Pa./North Pocono)** to Lawrence. The sophomore wideout caught the pass at the Shippensburg 35, running to the 15 where it looked like he would be tackled. He stopped and reversed field, allowing a hustling sophomore tight end **Mike Chatburn (Towanda, Pa./Towanda)** to lay a block on an unsuspecting Raider defensive back as Lawrence trotted

into the end zone for his second touchdown of the season.

Freshman **John Kaluzny (Mill Hall, Pa./Central Mountain)** led LHU with 30 yards on 14 carries, and Cicilioni was 4-of-9 for a career high 85 yards. Lawrence finished with three catches and 72 yards with a touchdown.

Sophomore safety **David Show (Mill Run, Pa./Connellsville)** recorded a game-high 14 tackles, tying the LHU season-best he set earlier. Junior **Derek Harsch (Wellsboro, Pa./Wellsboro Area)** made 11 stops from his linebacker spot, while Sones had six tackles, with two for loss including 1.5 sacks.

**Breakin' Records**

~ Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman** booted one field goal in the 24-12 win over Mansfield, giving him 19 three-pointers in his career, good for second place in the LHU record books, just five off the pace set by **Matt Mapes (2000)**.

~ Hagerman made one PAT in the loss to Shippensburg, giving him 38 in his career, good for sixth on the list. **Dan Guers (1948)** stands next on the list at 41, while the all-time leader is **Charles Traber (1986)** at 71.

~ Junior wideout **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** has 11 career touchdown catches, putting him 10th after just two years as a Bald Eagle. Three receivers (**Jeremy Burkett (1998)**, **Jon Spinosa (1995)** and **Tommy Allen (1972)**) are all poised at 12 TD grabs, while **Marcus Burkley (2003)** leads the list with 19.

~ **John Kaluzny's** 233 rushing yards against Mansfield were the fourth-most in school history and the tops for a Bald Eagle freshman.

## 2005 BALD EAGLE FOOTBALL

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** – Faced with the daunting task of being the Division I-AA National Champions' opening opponent, the Lock Haven University football squad (1-1) lost to James Madison University (1-0) tonight (Sept. 3) 56-0.

Falling victim to the big play, the Bald Eagles controlled the first and third quarters, surrounded by some breakdowns in both the second and fourth frames.

"I knew it would be a tough task to come in here, playing the defending champs at their home site," said LHU head coach **John Klacik**. "Our main goal was to be a better football team when we left this building tonight, and I'm proud of our guys that we accomplished that."

LHU caught the champs napping off the bat, recovering a surprise on-side kick for the first possession of the contest. The Bald Eagles were unable to do anything with that possession, but the Dukes would take the punt and march down the field on a nine-play, 82-yard touchdown drive to go up 7-0.

LHU would take over for the rest of the first quarter, getting plenty of yardage on the ground and a couple of completed passes as their best drive would stall at the JMU 37-yardline. Freshman **Jason Eby (Ulster, Pa./Athens)** looked poised in the first start of his career, completing four passes during the first quarter.

**TOWSON, Md.** – Lock Haven University football head coach **John Klacik**'s opening comment at the post-game press conference said it all for tonight's (Sept. 10) game.

"I'm glad we don't play another Division I-AA team next week," he said.

The last two weeks have been tough on the Bald Eagle squad (1-2) capped by a 70-0 loss at the hands of Towson University (2-0) tonight. Forced to play without their top two quarterbacks and their top two wide receivers, LHU mounted little offense, repeatedly forcing the Bald Eagle defense into tough spots.

The contest started out with some promise. After an interception on the first series for LHU resulted in a seven-yard rushing touchdown for Towson, the Bald Eagles were forced to punt.

On that Tiger possession, sophomore **David Show (Mill Run, Pa./Connellsville)** blitzed the TU quarterback, Sean Schaefer, popping the ball loose. Junior **Ryan Shaffer (DuBois, Pa./DuBois Area)** snatched the ball from mid-air, rumbling his way to the 12-yard line, a 23-yard interception return for the defensive tackle.

The next three plays set up for a 27-yard field goal, missing wide left. That was LHU's best scoring opportunity of the game, as they would fall victim to the strong Towson run game to the tune of a three-touchdown, 134-yard first quarter and a 21-0 deficit.

**LOCK HAVEN, Pa.** – Power Off-Tackle. Out of the 74 run plays the Lock Haven University football squad (2-4, 0-1 PSAC West) had in their 24-12 win over Mansfield University (0-5, 0-1 PSAC East) today (Oct. 1), 61 were the power off-tackle.

“When your offensive line plays as tough as they did today,” said LHU head coach **John Klacik**, “the backs have room to run and that transfers to a win.”

The Mountaineers knew it was coming but couldn't do anything about it. Freshman **John Kaluzny (Mill Hall, Pa./Central Mountain)**, carrying the ball for just the second game this season, managed an impressive 39-carry 233-yard performance for the Bald Eagles, seconded by junior **Chelstan C. Anderson II's (Halifax, Pa./Halifax)** 145 yards and two touchdowns. As a team, the Bald Eagles rushed for 434 yards on 71 carries. Kaluzny's effort ranks fourth in LHU's single game record book.

A local star for the Central Mountain High School squad, Kaluzny had a few extra fans in the Homecoming crowd today.

“I had a lot of friends and family in the stands,” he said. “and that really gave me a lift.”

**LOCK HAVEN, Pa.** – On a cold day giving Bald Eagle fans a preview of weather to come, key penalties and turnovers kept the Lock Haven University football team (2-5, 0-2 PSAC West) from getting their first conference victory today (Oct. 8) in a 26-7 loss to Shippensburg University (3-4, 1-2 PSAC West) at Hubert Jack Stadium.

The Raiders specialize in the Wing-T offense, a three running-back set that attempts to confuse with motion and relies on big rushing numbers. While the Bald Eagles were down 17-0 at the half, it had nothing to do with the powerful run game of Shippensburg.

“I thought our defense played the run real well today, the best I've seen anyone stop Ship this season,” said LHU head coach **John Klacik**. “They only had 26 rushing yards at the half. It was the pass defense that I was unhappy with at times.”

While the LHU defense was thinking run-first after a pair of first down rushes on the Raiders' first touch, quarterback Tony Gomez did a play-action rollout throwing a 38-yard floater of a pass that two Bald Eagles collided on to allow Ship wideout Kyle Fogarty a reception.
