Bringing with him 17 years of Division I and I-AA coaching experience, **John Klacik** was named Lock Haven University head football coach, university administration announced March 8. Klacik served most recently as offensive coordinator/offensive line coach at Youngstown State University.

Klacik, an LHU alum, has spent all but one season of his coaching career at YSU, and was a part of four NCAA I-AA National Championship teams. He started with the Penguins as tight ends coach, working his way up the ladder through the offense, moving to wide receivers, quarterbacks, offensive line and then as offensive coordinator for the last four seasons. Klacik worked under current Ohio State University head coach Jim Tressel for 12 years.

He also spent the 2000 season at Division I Wake Forest University, working with the quarterbacks before returning to YSU in his most recent role.

A standout wide receiver, Klacik graduated with a bachelors degree in sports/fitness management from LHU in 1988. He led the Bald Eagles in receiving yards in each of his four seasons at the Haven, ranking eighth in school history with 1,976 career yards.

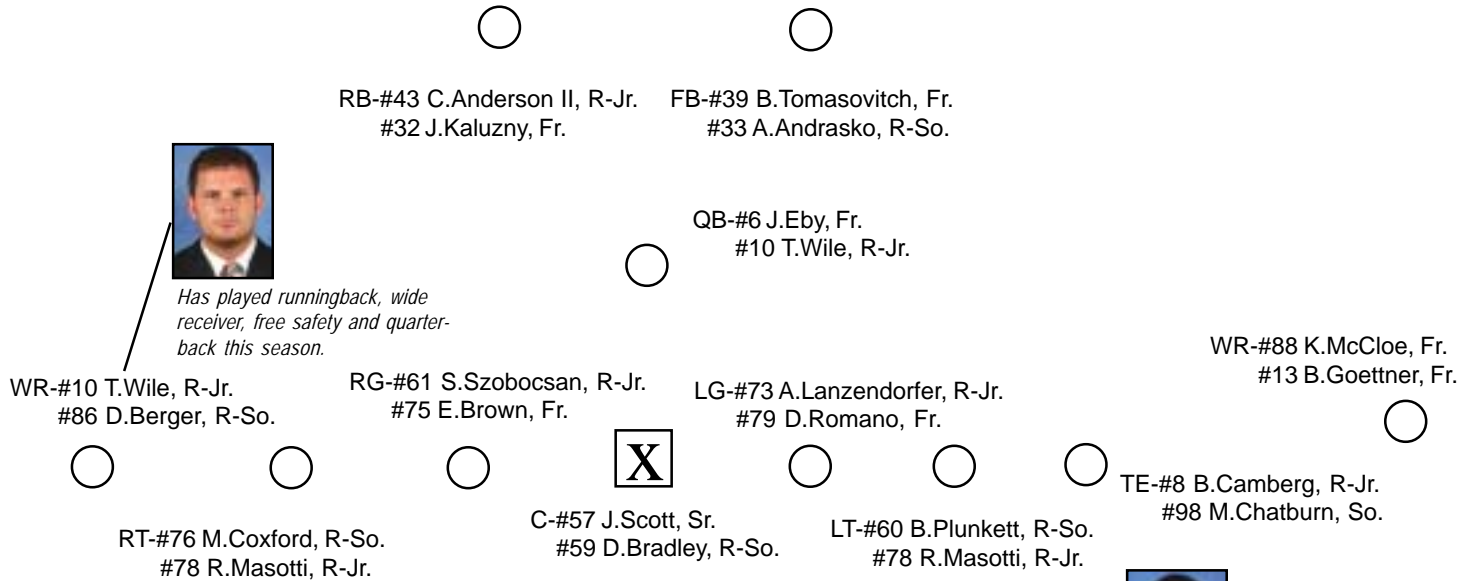

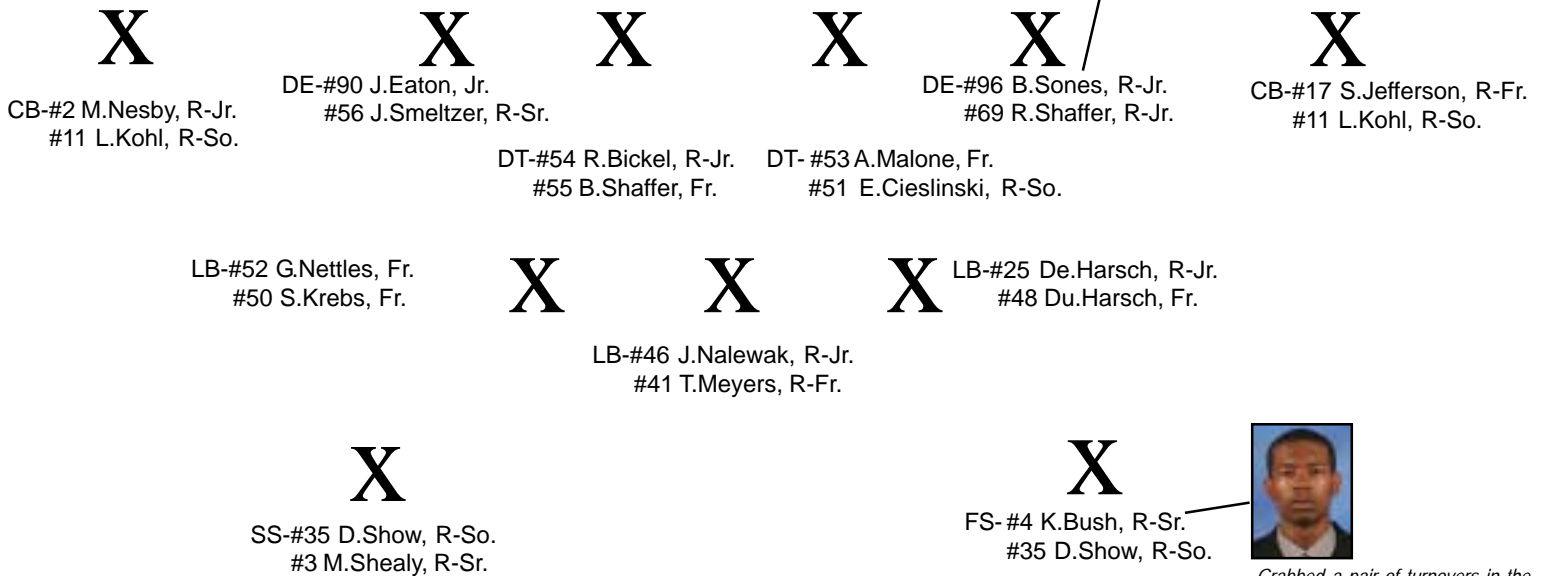

The Series

IUP has a 17-48-3 all-time advantage in the series, with IUP taking a 52-10 victory last season. LHU has failed to prevail in the last 23 meetings vs. the Indians.

Scouting the Indians

IUP is looking to bounce back after a 20-10 loss against Edinboro University last Saturday. Their wins have come against Catawba College in overtime (19-16); Shippensburg University (20-15); and Slippery Rock University (38-17). Bloomsburg University has dealt IUP its worst loss of the season by a score of 27-0. IUP averages 16.6 points per game and gives up an average of 21.9.

Junior runningback Chris Morgan leads the ground attack with 835 yards and 7 rushing touchdowns for a 119 yard per game average, which is good for 3rd highest in the conference. Freshman signal caller Andrew Krewatch has thrown for more than 1100 yards and 6 touchdowns.

Freshmen linebacker Brandon Lawrence and Senior linebacker Tye Desiderio lead the Indian defense with 56 tackles each. Sophomore defensive lineman Matt Scott has recorded a team high seven tackles for loss this season. Sophomore defensive back, Mike Reid is tops among the group in interceptions with three.

Indiana Head Coach Frank Cignetti

Frank Cignetti enters his 20th season at IUP with a record at the school of 177-45-1 and a career mark of 194-72-1, including a 17-27 slate while with the West Virginia Mountaineers. His 194 victories are third most among current Division II coaches. He has guided the Indians to 28 postseason games, more than any coach in Division II history. Cignetti owns a 15-13 playoff record, making him the second winningest coach in Division II postseason history.

Frank Cignetti was inducted into the IUP Athletic Hall of Fame in 1996. While Cignetti has served as IUP's head football coach since 1986, he started rebuilding the football program when he became athletic director four years earlier in 1982. At the time, IUP's fundraising program brought in \$10,000 to \$20,000 per year.

Cignetti and his wife Marlene are the parents of sons Curt and Frank Jr. and daughters Lisa and Theresa. Curt is the quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator at North Carolina State and Frank Jr. is the offensive coordinator at Fresno State.

Last Time out for the Indians

The Edinboro defense picked off four passes while the special teams produced a touchdown on a blocked punt as the Fighting Scots downed IUP, 20-10, Saturday afternoon at Miller Stadium.

Edinboro improved to 5-2 overall and 3-1 in the PSAC West and moved into a tie for first place in the division standings with California. IUP (3-4, 2-1), the only undefeated team in conference play entering the weekend, fell into a third place tie with Slippery Rock.

The Fighting Scots became only the second team to win three in a row over IUP in the 20-year tenure of head coach Frank Cignetti. The Indians lost to Slippery Rock each season from 1997-99.

Last time against IUP..

INDIANA, Pa. – There are good streaks and bad streaks. Joe DiMaggio's 56-game hitting streak is a good one, but the extension of Lock Haven University football's (3-6, 1-3 PSAC West) streak of futility against Indiana University to 23 games is a bad one. IUP deflated Lock Haven 52-10 today at Miller Stadium. IUP battered the Bald Eagles, earning scoring chances on each of their first seven drives. The only unsuccessful outcome was a missed field goal on their third possession.

LHU's first chance ended in a shanked punt, giving Indiana the ball at the Lock Haven 38 yard line. After an incomplete pass, IUP's Chris Morgan ran for the first of his three touchdowns on the day.

LHU moved the ball on the ensuing possession, hitting a 20-yard pass to **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** and a big 15-yard rush for **Maurice Walker**, but the drive stalled, turning over on downs at the IUP 30 yard line.

Indiana took the ball 70 yards on five plays, Morgan capping things with a 10-yard touchdown run. Brad Whitacre extended the IUP lead to 17-0 on a 21-yard field goal with 7:35 left in the half.

On the following possession, LHU quarterback **Tim Storino** coughed up the ball while being sacked, and Tyre Young returned the fumble 22 yards for a defensive touchdown.

LHU went to the ground attack on the next drive, handing the ball to Walker eight times, resulting in a 22-yard field goal for **Dan Hagerman (Scottdale, Pa./Southmoreland)**.

Golden Eagles brought an all-out rush on every punt, blocking a pair of kicks and tackling freshman **Greg Gartner (Womelsdorf, Pa./Conrad Wiser)** for a long loss on a third. Clarion tailback Michael Byrd picked up the team's first touchdown after Gartner was tackled.

The Bald Eagle defense did their best to make up for these mishaps, stopping Clarion on fourth down on one occasion, and allowing just a field goal on another.

A big blow came on a broken play in the second quarter. Erik Yonish, the second Golden Eagle quarterback of the contest, was pressured out of the pocket on a pass play, scrambling 50 yards down the left sideline for a touchdown and the 13-0 lead at the half.

"To win on the road, you need exceptional special teams, great defense and an offense that won't lose the game for you," said LHU head coach **John Klacik**. "We got a great effort from our defense tonight. We're going to be a great team someday as a result of efforts like that."

Senior safety **Kellen Bush (Pittsburgh/Penn Hills)**, a converted wideout, gave the team a bit of a spark in the second half, picking off Yonish on the first series and returning the turnover to the Clarion 35 yard-line. Penalties forced the Bald Eagles backward however, as they eventually were forced to punt.

A familiar face, junior **Troy Wile (Fayetteville, Pa./Chambersburg)** returned to his more familiar quarterback spot in the second half, running the option with LHU tailbacks **Chelstan C. Anderson II (Halifax, Pa./Halifax)** and **John Kaluzny (Mill Hall, Pa./Central Mountain)** to gain a few first downs and some momentum.

The defense came up big with 12 minutes left in the fourth quarter, getting a fourth-down stop from the half yard line, keeping the game at 16-0.

Bush ended another Clarion drive at 4:16 left in the fourth, as sophomore **David Show (Mill Run, Pa./Connellsville)** popped the ball loose from Byrd and Bush scooped it up, returning into Clarion territory.

Forced into a fourth and ten, Wile picked up the first down with a 13-yard scramble to continue the drive. After a Clarion sack made it fourth-and-19, Wile was pressured into an interception by Dwaon Woodard, effectively ending the contest.

Breakin' Records

- ~ Junior kicker **Dan Hagerman** booted one field goal in the 24-12 win over Mansfield, giving him 19 three-pointers in his career, good for second place in the LHU record books, just five off the pace set by **Matt Mapes (2000)**.
- ~ Hagerman made one PAT in the loss to Shippensburg, giving him 38 in his career, good for sixth on the list. **Dan Guers (1948)** stands next on the list at 41, while the all-time leader is **Charles Traber (1986)** at 71.
- ~ Junior wideout **Rafael Smith (Pittsburgh/Woodland Hills)** has 11 career touchdown catches, putting him 10th after just two years as a Bald Eagle. Three receivers (**Jeremy Burkett (1998)**, **Jon Spinosa (1995)** and **Tommy Allen (1972)**) are all poised at 12 TD grabs, while **Marcus Burkley (2003)** leads the list with 19.
- ~ **John Kaluzny's** 233 rushing yards against Mansfield were the fourth-most in school history and the tops for a Bald Eagle freshman.

LOCK HAVEN, Pa. – Power Off-Tackle. Out of the 74 run plays the Lock Haven University football squad (2-4, 0-1 PSAC West) had in their 24-12 win over Mansfield University (0-5, 0-1 PSAC East) today (Oct. 1), 61 were the power off-tackle.

“When your offensive line plays as tough as they did today,” said LHU head coach **John Klacik**, “the backs have room to run and that transfers to a win.”

The Mountaineers knew it was coming but couldn't do anything about it. Freshman **John Kaluzny (Mill Hall, Pa./Central Mountain)**, carrying the ball for just the second game this season, managed an impressive 39-carry 233-yard performance for the Bald Eagles, seconded by junior **Chelstan C. Anderson II's (Halifax, Pa./Halifax)** 145 yards and two touchdowns. As a team, the Bald Eagles rushed for 434 yards on 71 carries. Kaluzny's effort ranks fourth in LHU's single game record book.

A local star for the Central Mountain High School squad, Kaluzny had a few extra fans in the Homecoming crowd today.

“I had a lot of friends and family in the stands,” he said. “and that really gave me a lift.”

LOCK HAVEN, Pa. – On a cold day giving Bald Eagle fans a preview of weather to come, key penalties and turnovers kept the Lock Haven University football team (2-5, 0-2 PSAC West) from getting their first conference victory today (Oct. 8) in a 26-7 loss to Shippensburg University (3-4, 1-2 PSAC West) at Hubert Jack Stadium.

The Raiders specialize in the Wing-T offense, a three running-back set that attempts to confuse with motion and relies on big rushing numbers. While the Bald Eagles were down 17-0 at the half, it had nothing to do with the powerful run game of Shippensburg.
