2009 - 2010 Season Outlook

Robbie Waller won't classify it as nerves.

Rather, the Lock Haven University wrestling head coach is excited about the chance to lead the Bald Eagles.

"The team, as a whole, has done a great job of buying into what I've asked of them," Waller said. "They are excited, and part of that is because we've built a family atmosphere around them. We are all in this together. We move forward together, we win together and we lose together. Ultimately, the buck stops with me. Everything happens with the schedule, regiment and structure that I put into place. And I'm OK with that."

As the Bald Eagles open the season in Binghamton, N.Y., Sunday, there are a lot of outlookers wondering about the status of the wrestling program.

LHU is coming off a 7-9-1 record last season and finished 2-4 in the Eastern Wrestling League.

The university hasn't won a PSAC title since 2001. The EWL has been even longer: 1997.

But the program has undergone a number of changes.

Waller is now holding the reins as leader of the program, and has two excellent assistants under him in Matt Lackey and volunteer Teyon Ware.

Between the three, they were national champs four times and named All-Americans nine times.

"The program is moving forward and we are making progress," Waller said.

"Our staff has worked hard in making sure our guys' needs are met and they are fully aware of our expectations as a staff. We have a great staff in place. They don't need to look any further than our wrestling room to find someone who has done what they want to do - in terms of winning a national title, being an All-American and getting a degree from an accredited institution. That's where we start."

There are several new faces on the Bald Eagles' roster in 2009-2010, but others return.

Starter Nick Hyatt, 15-14 last season, returns back at 125. The red-shirt junior will look to build upon a successful 2008-2009 where he almost reached the

national tournament after a nice run through the EWLs.

"He has a lot of ability and fight to him," Waller said. "We need to address his weaknesses. He's a great competitor, and that's what you look for in kids. He'll be pushed by George Ester and Evan Kolb. I feel good at that weight all the way around."

Also returning is Aaron Ernest (10-16), Seth Creasy (3-3), Zach Kell (4-20), Gabe Murtorff (7-23) and Owen Wilkinson (4-7).

Four faces - who were at LHU last year but used a red-shirt season - are back.

Leading the way is Jeremie Cook, a national qualifier two years ago. He was 8-1 last season while wrestling unattached.

"He is good in all facets of the sport," Waller said of Cook. "In wrestling, if you have a glaring weakness, it will be exposed at the highest level. He really doesn't have one. Conditioning will be a factor, and he has to improve on some of the things he's good at, but can be great at. He's the kind of guy that can win a national title. Every indication right now shows me that he's working to get there."

Also back is John Trumbetti (133), Harry Turner (197) and Dan Craig (285).

Trumbetti, a red-shirt sophomore, was 21-10 as a freshman at LHU. While in his freshman year, Craig went 17-23. Last season wrestling unattached, Craig



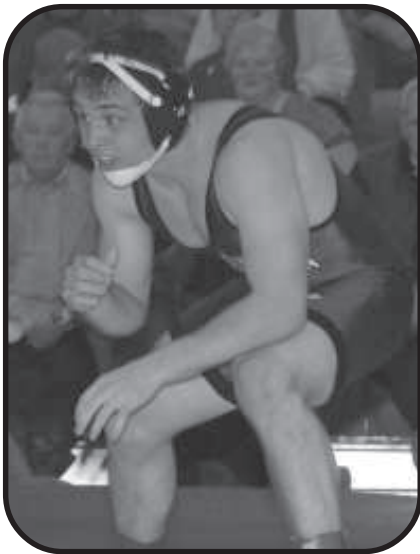

was 6-3. Turner, a red-shirt freshman, was 2-2 in unattached meets.

“Johnny is one of the hardest workers on this team,” Waller said. “He is a leader and a captain. He has stepped up in terms of leadership and wrestling. His practice partner is a two-time 141-pound champion in Teyon Ware. He has made gains. He can compete with the best in the country. He has to stay healthy and do it. And Dan and Harry both had great red-shirt years.”

Several newcomers will be asked to fill roles.



149-pounder Brock Parker

Probably the most touted is 149-pounder sophomore Brock Parker, a standout from Canton High School.

“Brock Parker is very talented,” Waller said. “He has all the accolades coming out of high school. His biggest challenge is going to be consistency in all that he does. And he’s going to be pushed hard by Jarred Kane because he’s has done everything he can to improve.”

Two others who will be fighting for mat-time include 157-pounder Jude Tropona and 165-pounder Kevin Dufresne.

“Tropona is an athletic kid, but I challenged him to get into shape,” Waller said. “If he is and listens to the staff, he is going to improve. He’s a competitor, but the fighting spirit can only take you so far when your lungs don’t want to go any further.”

“Kevin Dufresne is an athletic kid that holds great position and has great offense. When he is consistent in his work and mind set, he’s one of the best in the room.”

The schedule will provide a challenge.

In addition to the EWL schedule, dual meets include Rider, Bucknell, Hofstra, Penn State and Millersville. Tournaments include the Brute Binghamton Open, Mat-Town and the Southern Scuffle.

“When I came in July, I wasn’t happy with the schedule,” Waller said. “The EWL matches are good, and it’s nice to wrestle Penn State and Bucknell. Hofstra will be a good match as well. I thought the dual meet schedule was good, but I wasn’t very happy with the tournaments.

“I asked to go to the Bearcat Open. There are 300 competitors there on 15 mats and there will be a lot of wrestling going on, so I can take a lot of kids. Now, we can see what they have under the lights. We are ready to get our hands on some different faces. I think our schedule is fine for this year.

“We would like to add Big 10, Big 12 schools and make them part of the schedule. I think those schools would welcome wrestling a tradition like Lock Haven.”

Dr. Keith T. Miller, University President

Now beginning his fifth year as President, **Dr. Keith T. Miller** began his academic career in 1987 at Fairleigh Dickinson University's Teaneck Campus as an assistant professor in the management and marketing department and as director of the campus' MBA program. In 1991, his last year there, he also served as interim chair of the management and marketing department.

Dr. Miller moved to Quinnipiac College in Hamden, Conn., in 1991, where he spent three years as associate dean of the school of business.

He later became the dean of the college of business at Niagara University, a position he held from 1994 to 2001. During his tenure there, the university was granted accreditation by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) and enrollment in the business college increased by 20 percent.

Dr. Miller was named provost and vice chancellor of the University of Wisconsin, Oshkosh, in 2001. While serving as chief academic officer there, Dr. Miller restructured the Academic Affairs Division to focus on faculty support, learning outcomes and curricular innovation, and helped to expand the opportunities available to students to participate in research activities with university faculty. Under Dr. Miller's leadership, the University of Wisconsin, Oshkosh developed and expanded its online programming in business, nursing and social work; secured more than 200 external grants; entered into a number of articulation agreements with nearby technical colleges; and finalized five new international collaborative agreements.

Dr. Miller has won numerous honors, including both teacher and researcher of the year awards at Niagara University. He has published more than two dozen articles on a variety of business-related topics, has served on the editorial boards of several professional journals and has made numerous presentations to community, civic and professional organizations.

He served for two years on the Board of Directors of the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business International and for four years on the executive board of the Middle Atlantic Association of Colleges of Business Administration. He also has participated in a number of community activities and served on various boards, including the Learning for Life Youth Program in Oshkosh and the Oshkosh Chamber Development Corporation Board of Advisors. He has been involved with both the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, as well as the Big Brothers Association, YMCA and United Way.

Dr. Miller earned his Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral degrees from the University of Arizona.

Dr. Miller and his wife, Nicolette, have two young sons.



Sharon E. Taylor, Director of Athletics

Sharon E. Taylor is serving in her 23rd year as director of athletics at Lock Haven University of Pennsylvania. She was appointed to the position in 1988 after serving as the interim director in 1987-88. Taylor is responsible for coordinating and directing LHU's 18 intercollegiate sports.

The former head women's field hockey coach at LHU, Taylor earned an impressive 333-96-27 record at the helm of the Lady Eagles from 1973-95, making her the winningest coach in Lock Haven University history. Taylor guided the Haven to six national championships (one AIAW and five NCAA), seven PSAC titles and seven additional national championship or semi-final appearances. In 1995, in her final season as head coach, Taylor led the Lady Eagles to a perfect 21-0 record and her final PSAC and NCAA Division II crowns. In addition, her 1979 lacrosse team won the first Division II national championship sponsored by the United States Women's Lacrosse Association.

Organizationally, Taylor served as President of the United States Field Hockey Association from 2001-2007. She is the former president of the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators, has served in the past as president of the Eastern College Athletic Conference, the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women, and as vice president for Division III of the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. She served on the Board of Directors of the U.S. Olympic Committee for 15 years.

Among Taylor's many contributions to the field of athletics, she is responsible for having conceived and initiated the idea for a collegiate championship in field hockey. Working first within the USFHA and later in conjunction with the AIAW, she guided the origination and development of the championship, which was the forerunner of today's NCAA Championship. She was inducted into the National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) Hall of Fame in January of 2004.

Taylor is a graduate of Lock Haven State College and earned her Master's degree at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. She is an assistant professor in the College of Education and Human Services.

Waller, a Western Pa. native and former NCAA Division I National Champion at the University of Oklahoma begins his tenure in Mat Town, U.S.A., after four seasons as assistant coach at his alma mater.

Waller is a 2003 graduate of Oklahoma with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in English and has spent the last four seasons as a top assistant with the Sooners. Working under head coach Jack Spates, Waller assisted in all facets of the program, including recruiting some of the nation's top scholastic wrestlers.

Waller, who claimed an individual National Championship in 2003, is very excited about his opportunity with a storied program like Lock Haven.

Before returning to Norman, Okla., Waller spent time at the University of Missouri, Columbia. While at Missouri, he served as a graduate assistant and an assistant coach, helped them to 13th

and 11th place finishes in '04 and '05, respectively, and earned a Master's degree in Education in 2007.

Waller is no stranger to the elite level of wrestling competition. Along with his 2003 title, he was also a four-time NCAA qualifier and an All American in 2002.

As in his own wrestling career, Waller has been quick to help his athletes excel on the mats. He has coached 12 NCAA Division I All-Americans and four NCAA Finalists. In 2006, Waller helped Oklahoma to a third-place finish at the NCAA National Championship.

A Latrobe native, Waller was inducted into the Western Pennsylvania Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2006. He is a graduate of Mount Pleasant Area High School where he won a 1998 Pennsylvania State Championship.



Waller finished his scholastic career with a remarkable 128-3 record, was a two-time State Runner-up, and a FILA Junior Freestyle Champion.



Days before the 2009-10 season, Lock Haven University announced that Matthew Lackey, the 2003 Big Ten Male Athlete of the Year had been named the new assistant wrestling coach for the Bald Eagles.

Lackey will assist newly appointed head coach Robbie Waller in all facets of coaching and recruiting, as the two look to bring Lock Haven back to the forefront of the college wrestling world.

Lackey comes to Mat Town, U.S.A. with quite the resume, having won a NCAA Division I National Championship in 2003.

2008-2009 In Review

PSAC CHAMPIONSHIPS

ERIE, Pa. – The Lock Haven University wrestling team finished fourth at the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Championships today, hosted by Mercyhurst University.

The Bald Eagles were fourth behind team champion Edinboro (173.5), Bloomsburg (108) and Clarion (101). Mercyhurst, the 2008 host and PSAC newcomer was fifth overall, as the top four teams remained the exact same from last December's PSAC tournament in Clarion, Pa.

Senior Ben Hepburn (Williamsport, Pa./Loyalsock) led the way for the crimson and white as he placed second at 197 pounds.

Hepburn advanced to the finals by way of wins over Ryan Sutton and Shane Mallory. He recorded a 3-2 sudden victory of Bloomsburg's Sutton. In his second match of the tournament, Hepburn was solid again, downing East Stroudsburg's Mallory 5-2.

In the 197-pound final, Hepburn lost to Edinboro's Pat Bradshaw 5-3. Hepburn was the only Bald Eagle in the finals.

Lock Haven had five different grapplers battle it out in third-place bouts. Of the five grapplers in third-place bouts, two came away with wins.

Seniors Matt Fittery (Denver, Pa./Cocalico), 149 and Tom Kocher (Lancaster, Pa./Manheim Township), 184 both placed third today.

Fittery kicked off his tournament in a big way, starting with a tech fall and a major. In his opening match he downed Brett Martinez of Kutztown by way of the tech fall and followed that up with a 12-1 major over JJ Lester of Millersville.

Fittery fell in his third match, 3-1 to Bloom's George Hickman, but the Bald Eagle senior responded in a big way with a pin to advance to the third-place bout.

In the third-place match Fittery majored ESU's Scott Heckman 17-9.

Kocher won 11-9 in his first match of the tournament, before falling to No. 1 seed Chris Honeycutt of Edinboro 7-2. Kocher came back to win 10-2 (major) over Mercyhurst's Bryan Wofff, advancing to the third-place bout.

He won 6-2 over Jacob Tazzi of Gannon to take home bronze medal honors.

Nick Hyatt (Boyertown, Pa./Boyertown), Billy Ashnault (South Plainfield, N.J./South Plainfield) and Owen Wilkinson (Howell, Mich./Hartland) all earned fourth-place finishes for The Haven.

Hyatt went 2-2 on the day at 125. He opened the day with a 4-2 win, but was edged 3-2 by eventual champion Jay Ivanco in his second match of the day. Hyatt got a major decision in his next match, but fell 10-3 in the third-place bout.

Ashnault lost 6-3 to start the day, but cruised back into the third-place bout by way of three wins. He lost 3-0 to Jason Gaffey to take home fourth place.

Wilkinson lost his opening match, but responded in a big way with two straight pins. Following two pins to get back on track, Wilkinson downed No. 1 seed Sal Lasacari 7-6 to earn the right to battle for third, but lost 6-1 to Ricky Donald.

Gabe Murtorff(Boiling Springs, Pa./Boiling Springs) went 2-2 on the day and won the fifth-place bout. Murtorff opened his tournament with a 3-2 when over host-Mercyhurst's Kenny Blusha and then topped Blusha a second time in the 5th-place bout.

Aaron Ernest (Selinsgrove, Pa./Selinsgrove) was sixth for LHU. Ernest went 2-2 at 165 and his first win was a special one as he pinned Joe Yavoich in just 56 seconds. In the fifth-place bout Ernest lost 6-2 to Jeff Jacobs of ESU.

Dave Richmond (Oxford, N.J./Warren Hills) went 2-2 for LHU at 157.

Dan Tolbert (Chattanooga, Tenn./Red Bank), a freshman was in action for the first time in his Bald Eagle career and went 0-2 on the day.

LOCK HAVEN, Pa. – Senior Matt Fittery (Denver, Pa./Cocalico) of the Lock Haven University wrestling team is headed to St. Louis, Mo. after qualify for the NCAA Division I National Championships by way of his 149-pound Eastern Wrestling League (EWL) title.

Fittery took home the crown tonight in Thomas Field as the Bald Eagles played host to the 34th annual league championships.

Lock Haven was also led by one second-place and two third-place finishers.

LHU was fifth overall with 80 points.

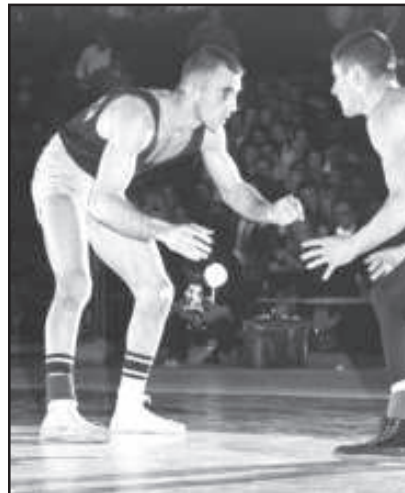

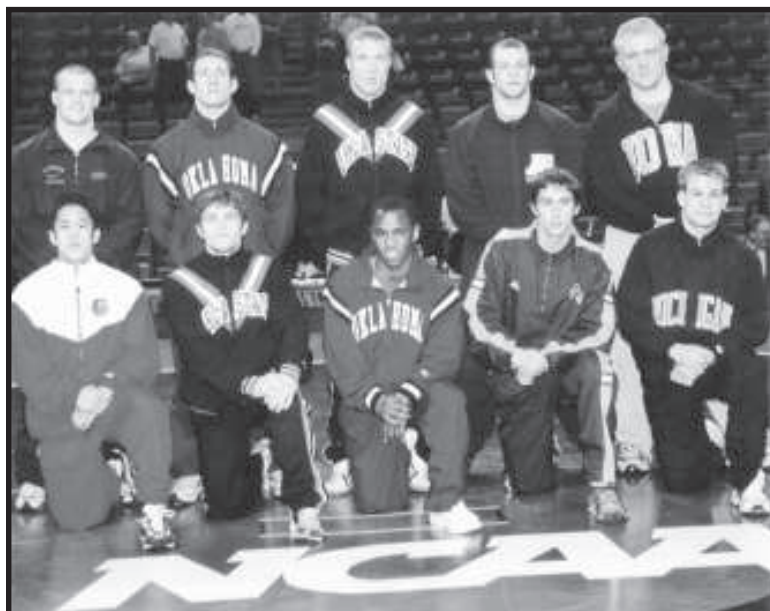
