



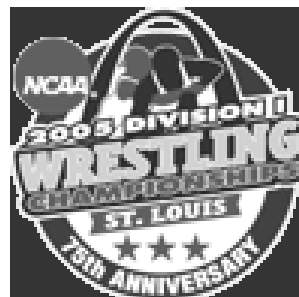

The Meet

Six members of the Lock Haven University wrestling team will make the trip to St. Louis for the 2005 Division I NCAA Wrestling Championship.

Juniors No. 16 **Morgan Horner (Hasbrouck Heights, N.J./Hasbrouck Heights)**, and No. 20 **Joshua A. Medina (Las Vegas/Pima C.C.)**, sophomores **Carlos Ponce (Hialeah, Fla./Hialeah Miami Lakes)** and **Seth Martin (Selinsgrove, Pa./Selinsgrove)** and freshmen **Obe Blanc (Naples, Fla./Lely)** and **Matt Fittery (Denver, Pa./Cocalico)** all qualified for national competition by finishing in the top three at the Eastern Wrestling League (EWL) Championships March 6.

Last Time out for LHU

The Lock Haven wrestling team stole the show on day two of the 30th EWL Championships, placing all 10 wrestlers, with six earning automatic trips to the NCAA Championships May 17-19 in St. Louis. The team made a push up to second from fifth place after sessions one and two on Saturday, and also crowned two EWL Champions.

Edinboro University took the team title at 113 points, LHU finished second with 104 points. Third place went to the University of Pittsburgh with 98 points, followed by West Virginia University with 93, Bloomsburg University with 81, Clarion University and Cleveland State University tied with 62 points.

"I'm amazed at how these guys responded today," said LHU head coach **Rocky Bonomo**. "My assistant (coaches) **Mike Rogers, Mike**



A 14-year veteran of the Lock Haven University wrestling program, **Anthony "Rocky" Bonomo** begins season number three at the helm of the Bald Eagle wrestling program after assuming the reigns in the spring of 2002. An assistant coach with the LHU program since 1990, Bonomo is the ninth coach in school history, succeeding Carl Poff, head coach from 1990-2002.

Bonomo and the Bald Eagles battled through a tough schedule in 2003-04, posting a 4-10 record and a 7th-place Eastern Wrestling League finish.

He led the 2003 Bald Eagles to the program's 12th-straight winning season with a 12-11 overall record. The Haven added a runner-up finish at the PSAC championships and a fourth-place showing at the Eastern Wrestling League Tournament in addition to sending four grapplers to the NCAA Division I National Wrestling Championships. One Bald Eagle came home an All-American while the team placed 35th overall at the national tournament.

Bonomo has brought a wealth of experience and talent to Team Lock Haven, contributing to the Division I program in all phases of its operation. Among his many responsibilities, Bonomo directs the teaching, academic monitoring and fundraising efforts of the Bald Eagle squad.

Maney and **Joe Eaton** really helped get these guys ready for the war. We out-fought, out-hustled and out-wrestled our opponents today.”

Junior 149-pounder **Joshua A. Medina** controlled much of his title bout with Edinboro’s Ron Doppleheuer. Medina scored a first-minute takedown from which Doppleheuer would earn an escape. Medina then got a big takedown with four seconds left in the first for a 4-1 lead after one. Doppleheuer earned the match’s only second-period points with an escape to cut the lead to 4-2. Medina answered with an escape of his own, and nabbed a late takedown to cinch his first EWL title in his first attempt. Medina is the first EWL Champion for the Bald Eagles at 149 since All-American **JaMarr Billman** in 2002.

Morgan Horner controlled his bout with Chad Hoare, getting revenge for his two losses this season to the Bloomsburg 197-pounder. Horner scored a big takedown in the second minute, adding a nearfall shortly thereafter. Horner would finish the first with a 7-3 lead. Horner would add a takedown in the waning seconds of the second period for a 9-4 advantage. Up 11-5 in the third with 26 seconds left, Horner and Hoare butted heads, with Horner on the losing end sporting a gash on his forehead. Horner would return after assistance from the LHU athletic training staff, scoring another takedown for the 14-5 bonus points. Horner is the first champion for LHU at 197 since Avery Zerkle did it in 2001.

125-pounder **Obe Blanc** topped Cleveland State’s Zach Wornoff to take third place and an automatic bid to the NCAA Championships.

At 133, junior **Jim Collins (Jonestown, Pa./Northern Lebanon)** failed to score any points in the third period of the third-place bout, dropping to Pitt’s Drew Headlee 8-4.

Freshman **Matt Fittery** joined Blanc at nationals with a convincing 12-4 win over WVU’s Vince Gioiella. Fittery scored six unanswered points in the final period to seal the third-place win, his second over Gioiella in under a month.

At 157, sophomore **Seth Martin** followed that up with a 5-0 shutout of Edinboro’s Matt Hill in the third-place bout, earning a spot on the plane to St. Louis.

165-pounder **B.J. Mikeska (Derry, Pa./Bloomsburg University)** dropped the first LHU bout of the day, slipping to West Virginia’s Zac Fryling 8-4. Mikeska rebounded with an 8-7 win over Marcus Surin of Clarion, getting an escape in the final period to steal the win.

Sophomore **Carlos Ponce** added his third-place win with a 7-2 decision over host Clarion’s Chris Goings. Ponce scored the final five points to nab the come-from-behind win and earn a trip to the NCAAs.

At 184, sophomore **Mike Metzger (Reading, Pa./Governor Mifflin)** was overpowered by CSU’s Ron Howard in a 14-4 loss. Metzger would rebound with a smart 3-2 win over Jesse Hasseman of Bloomsburg. Metzger had a final-period escape hold up for the fifth-place victory.

Heavyweight **Jamie Nagel (Shade Gap, Pa./Mount Union Area)** lost to Edinboro’s Joe Hennis by second-period fall and couldn’t rebound against the Huskies’ Mike Spaid, settling for sixth place with an 8-0 loss.

suffered a loss in the wrestleback quarterfinals at the 2004 NCAA Division I National Wrestling Championships held in the Savvis Center in St. Louis, Mo.

Maney matched up against the 11th-seeded Jeff Ratliff of Ohio State in his bout. After a scoreless opening period, Maney controlled Ratliff the entire second period to accumulate riding time. An escape by the Bald Eagle in the third gave him the lead on the scoreboard, 1-0. Both wrestlers grappling for the advantage, they became locked up and as Maney was working for control, he was called down by the official and Ratliff scored the fall from the neutral position at 6:08. Maney, a two-time All-American, closes out the season at 34-8 and a stellar career tied for fifth on the LHU all-time wins list with a 119-29 overall ledger.

At 157 pounds, Brenneman faced off against the sixth-seed Johnny Hendricks of Oklahoma State. Brenneman fell behind early, down 7-1 after one period. An escape and takedown for Hendricks in the second brought the tally to 10-1, and despite fervent attempts by Brenneman to score in the final period, he would wrap up on the low end of the 11-1 score. Brenneman closes out his senior season with a record of 35-11.

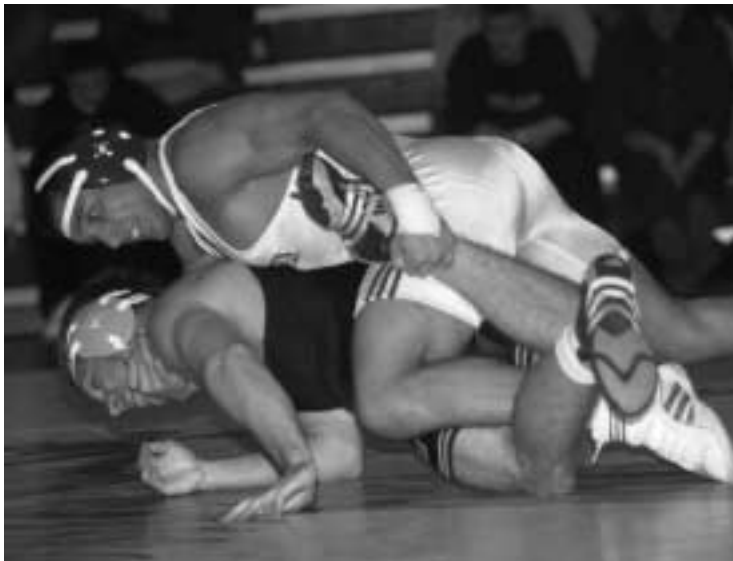
